WE COME TO PRAISE GOD

As people who believe in Jesus, we begin Mass by making the Sign of the Cross:

Priest: In the name of the Father,

and of the Son,

and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

We show our love for God and one another as we pray:

Priest: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ,

and the love of God,

and the communion of the Holy Spirit

be with you all.

All: And with your spirit.



WE ASK PARDON

We remember that we have not always loved God and others as we should, and we pray.

All: I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The priest reminds us that God loves us.

Then we ask God to forgive our sins.

All: Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

THINKFor what sins are you sorry?

WE SING OUR PRAISE TO GOD

On special days, everyone prays or sings the Glory to God.



All: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

We praise you,
we bless you,
we adore you,
we glorify you,
we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King,
O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world,

receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father.

Amen.

The priest begins the Opening Prayer by saying "Let us pray." We answer "Amen" to the prayer.

GOD SPEAKS TO US IN THE BIBLE

At the end of the first reading, the reader says:

The word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God.

We respond with a psalm.



Before the priest or deacon reads from the Gospel, we stand and sing the joyful word—alleluia—to show we are happy to hear about Jesus:

Priest: A reading from the holy Gospel according to ______.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel tells us about Jesus and his teachings. At the end, the priest or deacon says:

The Gospel of the Lord

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.




THE PRIEST EXPLAINS THE READINGS

The priest invites us to get ready to offer Jesus' gift.
