

The Jesus Story


MOTHER


Draw a picture of a mother or make a collage about mothers out of pictures cut from magazines and newspapers.

PARENTS: We begin the story of Jesus' life by telling about the angel's appearance to Mary. Introducing children to Jesus through his mother helps them see God's Son as someone unique, yet like themselves. They, too, have a mother and were once babies. Recall with your child the happy moments of his or her babyhood. Talk about your childs name and why you chose it. Children enjoy

looking at their baby pictures and hearing you tell them how they have grown and how special they are to you.

Something unusual happened to Mary. An angel brought her a message from God. The angel told her that she was going to have a baby. Joseph was a kind and good person. But when he learned that Mary was going to have a baby, he decided not to marry her.

FATHER

Draw a picture of a father or make a collage about fathers out of pictures cut from magazines and newspapers.

PARENTS: Through the story about Joseph, we introduce children to the man who was to be Jesus' father on earth. What little Scripture says about Joseph portrays him as kind, hardworking, and loyal. Recall some happy moments your child has shared with his or her father or another adult male who takes a kindly interest in the child's life. Plan activities that father and child can share. A child

who has a close, loving relationship with his or her earthly father is prepared to see God as a kind of heavenly parent, protective and loving.
