
"I like the stories in the Bible," Jada said. "Sometimes my mother reads us stories about how much God loves me. They make me feel good."

Noah opened a window and let a bird fly out. The bird flew away but when it came back to the ark, it had a green leaf in its beak.


Noah knew the water was gone when he saw the plants and trees. Noah, his family and all the animals left the ark. Noah thanked God for keeping them all safe.
