## God the Father

The fatherhood of God is a theme found throughout Scripture. From an early date, the Israelites conceived of their God as the Father of his chosen people, and of themselves as his first-born son. (See Exodus 4:22.) Jesus invited his disciples to address God as "Abba," the affectionate Aramaic word for "father." Saint Paul describes how Christians have received a "spirit of adoption" that inspires them to call God by this name. (See Romans 8:15.)

## Father and Son

Through his mother, Jesus Christ belonged to the human family. However, he was God's Son in a unique and privileged sense. He was and is the true and perfect image of his heavenly Father. The works of charity, compassion, and self-sacrifice that he performed on earth were the works of the Father who dwelt in him. For this reason, the life and death of Jesus are the supreme revelation of the Father's love for humanity. Jesus Christ, God's Incarnate Son, revealed the Father's true nature to humans in a way that no mere prophet or teacher, however wise and good, could have done. Jesus came bearing God the Father's love, and he challenges his Church to share this divine love with others.

## TEACHING CHAPTER 4

## The Experience of Love

Jesus shows us that God the Father loves unconditionally and forgives mercifully.

- Families are central to the life of first graders, so the image of God as a loving parent is one to which many children can easily connect. Today's children, however, have had diverse experiences of family. Some children have not had loving fathers. Others have had no contact with their fathers at all. Such children may need other models to help them understand their relationship to God.
- Talk to children about any adults whose actions have been for them a sign of God's love.
- In himself, God is infinitely greater than any earthly image. He loves each child more than anyone else, even a parent, can.

- Encourage them to talk with a partner about what friends do for each other.
- Give children a few minutes to think and talk about what they will draw.


## Close

Remind children that good friends care for each other.

Interpreting Stories Some children display a natural flair for interpreting stories. Others find this skill more difficult to acquire.

- Make sure children understand that they must wait to be called on to answer questions about a poem or a story. This will help you avoid a situation where the same one or two children always interpret the poems or stories you read.
- Call on different children each time.

## TEACHER BACKGROUND

The Eternal Trinity God has always been a Trinity. The Son and the Holy Spirit are eternal, just as the Father is. There was never a time when the Father alone existed. But Jesus Christ is both God and man. At a particular point in history, God the Son took on a human nature. The Son will remain united with this human nature forever.


## SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND

"Show Us the Father" We know that our God is a God of love because of Jesus.

- Jesus' whole life-his words and his actions, what he said and didn't say -revealed the Father.
- Jesus' whole life was an expression of love for sinful humans. Since the Son became man in order to do his Father's will, the depth of the Father's love for us is unmistakably manifested in Jesus.
