SACRAMENT OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST


Jesus told the people, "I am the Bread of Life. Eat of this Bread. You will live forever."

We can eat of the Bread of Life when we receive Jesus in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Holy Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is the food for God's life in us.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

BEFORE WE RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION:

- We ask God's forgiveness for our sins. We say "Lord Have Mercy. Christ Have Mercy. Lord Have Mercy."
- 2. We ask for one another's forgiveness. The priest says, "The peace of the Lord be with you always." We say, "And with your spirit." Then, if appropriate, the priest adds: "Let us offer each other the sign of peace." We then give one another the sign of peace.
- 3. Before Communion, the priest says, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." We answer, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed."
