Catechist Background

As a Catholic, where do you learn the values

If you are fortunate enough to have photos of your grandparents or even great-grandparents, you have probably looked closely at them to see whether there is a family resemblance. Our ancestors would probably want to take a good look at us, too. They would probably like to know whether the values they held dear are now embraced by our generation.

When we read the Bible we are reading the book of God's Word. We find out about our ancestors in faith and about ways that we can live out our faith. We learn that we are a chosen people, cherished by a loving and forgiving God. In the first part of the Bible, the Old Testament, we learn of God's faithfulness to his people Israel. Through reading history, poetry, prayers, and stories we hear God's promise to send a Savior.

Make it Happen

Distribute copies of the Scripture reproducible master. Read aloud the script. Then invite the children to write what the townspeople might have said.

Question Corner

List the following Bible story topics on the board or on chart paper. Ask volunteers to name which part of the Bible each story

is in. Then have the children work in pairs to rate the stories from 1 to 6, 1 being their most favorite and 6 being their least favorite:

- · God creates the world.
- the story of Noah and the ark
- · the story of the birth of Iesus
- . Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan
- · Jesus blesses the children.

Then have the pairs share their ratings with the entire group.

More to Explore

Share and/or invite the children to share a few good-news stories about families, friends, team mates, neighbors, school faculty or students, and parish members. Keep a record of the good-news stories. Then, have the children act as reporters for a good-news TV program featuring a few of the stories.

Meeting Individual Needs

An Atmosphere of Acceptance

In the New Testament Jesus provides us with the perfect example of accepting people as they are. Make your room a place of acceptance. Consider taking a few extra minutes every day to praise the good work, behavior, or accomplishments of one or more of the children. Make sure that, over time, each child has been singled out with words of praise.

Enrichment Ideas

Chapter Story

ost of Miss Miller's second grade class was outside for recess, but Marcos, Joanna, and Chris stayed inside. They helped Miss Miller decorate the bulletin board with the classes' drawings about their favorite books.

Marcos pointed to his drawing and said, "I drew a picture of Willy the dog. My favorite book is about Willy and the family who find him when they are on vacation."

Joanna asked Miss Miller, "What kind of books do you like to read?"

Miss Miller said, "Oh, I like to read many different kinds of books!"

Chris said, "Tell us about your favorite book."

Miss Miller told the children, "Well, I have a book that is very special to me. It is my favorite for two particular reasons. The first reason is that my grandmother gave me the book on my seventh birthday. It was an extra special book because she had used it in school. My grandmother said that when she was in school this book was called a reader."

"What is the book about, Miss Miller?" Marcos asked.
"Well, it's about many different things. The second reason
the book is my favorite is because it has stories about famous
people, animals, and children. It also has poems and songs."

Joanna asked Miss Miller, "Would you bring the reader into school for us to see?"

Miss Miller answered, "Sure, Joanna! And I will even share some of the stories and poems with you."

FAITH and MEDIA

Invite the children to describe some video versions of Bible stories that they have seen. Ask them to tell why they like or dislike watching the videos. Explore with the children how watching particular videos of Bible stories can help them to grow in their faith. If possible, show the class an age appropriate video version of a Bible story and carry on a similar discussion.

CHAPTER PROJECT: A PAGEANT OF BIBLICAL PERSONS

Help the children recall their favorite stories about Jesus. Then ask them to recall their favorite stories that Jesus told when he taught his followers. You could also have the children look through We Believe Grade 2 for ideas or reminders. If possible, provide a few copies of We Believe Grade 1 for suggestions.

Then have each child choose one person from the stories. Help them to make a simple costume and

select an appropriate prop to represent the biblical person. An example would be a child dressed as Zacchaeus in a colorful tunic holding a picture of a tree (because Zacchaeus was short and climbed a tree to see Jesus).

Have the children wear their costumes and carry their props in a parade. Provide time for each child to explain who he or she is dressed as and to tell a story about the person.

Graphic Organizer for Enrichment

Make a graphic organizer that identifies the Gospels of the New Testament. To do so, draw a circle on the board. Write the words Gospels of the New Testament inside the circle. Draw four rectangles with lines connecting them to the circle. Name the Gospels. Have volunteers write the names of Matrhew, Mark, Luke, and John in the rectangles. At this time do not require that the children memorize the names of the Gospels.

The New Testament is the second part of the Bible.

Luke 4:42-43

One morning a crowd went to see Jesus. They tried to stop him from leaving their town. But Jesus said, "To the other towns also I must proclaim the good news of the kingdom of God, because for this purpose I have been sent." (Luke 443)

This reading is from the second part of the Bible. The second part of the Bible is the New Testament. The New Testament is about Jesus Christ, his disciples, and the Church.

Four of the books in the New Testament are called the **Gospels**. They are about Jesus' teachings and his life on earth.

The word *gospel* means "good news. We learn the Good News of Jesus Christ in the Gospels.

- God is our Father who loves and forgives us.
- Jesus is with us always. He teaches us how to love and do good.
- The Holy Spirit helps and guides us.
- What is your favorite story about Jesus?

Direct attention to the picture of Jesus. Have a volunteer read the Scripture story on page 78. Explain: Jesus went from town to town to announce the Good News about God's love. Tell the group that another word for announce is proclaim.

Write the words New Testament and Gospels on the board. Explain: The New Testament is the second part of the Bible. The Gospels are four very special books of the New Testament. Then have volunteers read the two

paragraphs after the Bible reading. Hold up the Bible. Show the beginning and end of the New Testament. Explain: The Gospels are the first four books of the New Testament. The word gospel means "good news." In the Gospels Jesus shows us the Good News about God and his love for us. Then read aloud the three bulleted items listed after the fourth paragraph on page 78.

Read the question. Invite volunteers to share what their favorite story about Jesus is.

Science

Activity Materials: rock, large plastic container, pitcher of water

Demonstrate the effects of water and wind on rock. Place a large rock in the center of a container. Pour water on the rock. Ask what happens. Then have children stand around the rock and blow like the wind on it. Help the children conclude that water and wind do not usually affect rocks in a short period of time.

Read aloud the statement at the top of page 79. Ask: What are some things lesus taught us? Have a few volunteers share their responses. Affirm the children by saying: You remember some things Jesus taught. That shows vou have listened well. Then invite the children to listen as volunteers read the Scripture passage.

Explain: Rock is strong. Jesus was trying to tell us that listening to his teaching helps us to grow strong in our faith.

Read the last paragraph on page 79. Stress: We show we have listened to Jesus' teaching when we love and help others.


