"And the King shall answer and say to them, 'Truly I tell you, inasmuch as you have done it to one of the least of these my brothers, you have done it to me.'

"Then he shall also say to those on his left hand, 'Be off, you accursed ones, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you did not feed me,





thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink. I was a stranger and you did not take me in. I was naked and you did not clothe me. I was sick and in prison and you did not visit me."

"Then they too will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did

not help you?"

"Then shall he answer them saying, 'Truly I say to you, inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did not do it to me.'

"And these shall go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

## JUDAS PLOTS TO BETRAY JESUS

And it came to pass when Jesus had finished all these sayings, that he said to his disciples, "You know that after two days is the feast of the Passover and the Son of man is to be betrayed and crucified."
