## **Faith Words**

#### worship

Worship means to honor and love God above all else.

#### sacraments

The sacraments are the seven signs of God's love for us that Jesus gave the Church. We share in God's love when we celebrate the sacraments.

#### Words and Actions of Jesus

Iesus used words and actions to show God's love for us. One time Igirus came to Iesus. Jairus was a religious leader who had great faith in God. Jairus asked Jesus to help his daughter who was very sick. Read what happened next.

Jesus and his disciples followed Igirus to his house. Jesus entered the house and went over to the daughter of Jairus. Jesus took her by the hand and said, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl got up immediately and walked around. Based on Mark 5:22-24, 38, 41-42

People came to believe in Jesus. They came to believe that Jesus is the Son of God.

#### The Church Uses Words and Actions

God loves us very much. One way we show our love for God is to worship him. We use words and actions to worship God. We honor and love God above all else. Our words and actions tell God we believe in him, hope in him, and love him.

When we worship God, we listen to God. We give adoration to God and praise him. We pray aloud and we sing. We stand and sit and walk in procession.

## Faith-Filled People

#### Mark the Evangelist

Saint Mark is one of the four Evangelists. He wrote one of the four Gospels in the New Testament. In Mark's Gospel we read about the words and actions of Jesus. The Church celebrates the feast day of Saint Mark the Evangelist on April 25.





#### The Seven Sacraments

Iesus gave the Church a special way to worship. He gave the Church the seven sacraments. The seven sacraments are signs of God's love for us. Jesus is really present with us when we celebrate the sacraments. The Holy Spirit helps us to celebrate the sacraments. When we celebrate the sacraments, we share in God's love.


Confirmation The Holy Spirit


#### **Sacrament Words and Actions**

We are baptized with water. We are blessed with oil. We offer and share bread and wine. We bless and receive blessings. We make promises.

All the words and actions we use in the sacraments show that God is sharing his love with us. They help us to give thanks and praise to

God for all he has done for us.

## Our Cattholic Faith

#### **Sacramentals**

The Church uses objects and blessings, words and actions to help us worship God. These are called sacramentals. Holy water is one of the sacramentals the Church gives us. We bless ourselves with holy water. This reminds us of Baptism and that we are children of God.

# With My Family

#### This Week ...

In chapter 11, "We Worship God," your child learned about worshiping God. By listening to and thinking about the Gospel story of Jairus's daughter (Mark 5:41–42), your child discovered that the words and actions of Jesus helped people come to believe and trust in God and in God's love for us. The Church uses special words and actions to celebrate the sacraments. Through the celebration of the sacraments we worship God and we are made sharers in the life and love of God.

#### **Sharing God's Word**

Read together the Bible story in Mark 5:41-42 about Jesus healing the daughter of Jairus or read the adaptation of the story on page 98. Emphasize that Jesus healed people to show them God's love.
