



WE BELIEVE

Jesus had many disciples. He chose twelve of them to be his Apostles. He wanted them to share in his mission. Many other men and women disciples gathered with the Apostles to spread the Good News about Jesus.

One of the Apostles was named Simon. Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter. The name Peter means "rock." Jesus chose Peter to be the leader of the Apostles. He told Peter, "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church." (Matthew 16:18)

How many of the Apostles can you name? They are Peter, Andrew, James and John (sons of Zebedee), Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, Matthew, James (the son of Alphaeus), Thaddeus, Simon, and Judas Iscariot. Later Matthias took the place of Judas. After Jesus' Ascension the Apostles shared with the people all the good things Jesus had said and done. They traveled from place to place teaching what Jesus had taught them. They baptized people as Jesus had commanded them.

In every location the Apostles gathered the baptized into communities. These communities were the beginning of the Church. As more and more communities were formed, the Church grew. The first members of the Church looked to Peter and the Apostles as their leaders.


WE BELIEVE

Like Jesus, the Apostles chose leaders to succeed them. A successor is one who succeeds, or takes the place of, another. These new leaders would take the place of the Apostles and continue their work.

The Apostles laid their hands on the heads of these new leaders. The Apostles asked the Holy Spirit to strengthen these men in their work. In this way the Apostles gave these leaders the same authority that Jesus had given to them. These leaders became the successors of the Apostles.

As time passed each of these leaders was given the title of bishop. Bishops are the successors of the Apostles. The bishops continue to lead the Church. They lead local areas of the Church called dioceses.

The **pope** is the bishop of the diocese of Rome in Italy. He continues the leadership of Peter. Together with all the bishops, he leads and guides the whole Catholic Church




Just as each person has special characteristics, so does the Catholic Church. The Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. We call these characteristics the marks of the Church.

The first mark is that the Church is *one*.

The Church is one community called together by God. Through the Church,
God strengthens us to live and worship together.

All members of the Church are united by Baptism. We gather to celebrate the sacraments. We share with one another. We live and work together as one community.





The second mark is that the Church is holy. God is all good and holy. God shares his holiness with the Church. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, all members of the Church receive a share in God's life. This share in God's life makes us holy. We are all called to become like Christ. As members of the Church we grow in holiness when we celebrate the sacraments. We also grow in holiness when we love God and others as Jesus did.

God loves all people. God shares his love with us through the Church. The Church is open to all people. It is universal. The third mark of the Church is that it is *catholic*. The word *catholic* means "universal."

Jesus sent his Apostles out to every part of the world. They spread the Gospel to everyone, and the Church continued to grow. Even today people everywhere are invited and welcomed to become members of the Church. There are Catholics on every continent and in every country.

The fourth mark of the Church is that it is apostolic. The word apostolic comes from the word apostle.





Jesus chose the Apostles to be the first leaders of the Church. Their mission was to teach the Good News and to baptize new members. By Baptism all members of the Church share in the work of spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ.




The bishops are the successors of the Apostles. They continue the mission of the Apostles in three very important ways.

- They teach. The bishops are the official teachers of the Church. They make sure that the members of the Church know and believe the teachings of Jesus.
- They *lead*. The bishops are the main leaders of the Church.
- They sanctify. The bishops work to make the People of God holy. This is what it means to sanctify. They do this through prayer, preaching, and the celebration of the sacraments.


