CHAPTER BACKGROUND



Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

Matthew 6:8

Loving Father

Although God is referred to with masculine terminology, the Church teaches that he is neither male nor female. God is God.

The constant analogy for God is that of a loving parent. Creation is our evidence that God provides for his children. We see in God's gifts to us that we are loved and cared for, even when we do not understand the way that the world works. Even as adults, we are still children of God.

Parents as God's Workers

Parents play a major role in the lives of their children. The parents or guardians who raise a child know that child's needs and desires. From careful and loving observations, as well as their knowledge of the world, parents learn what is important for their children: to provide for each child's physical and spiritual needs.

All parenthood is modeled after God's parenthood. What this means is that parents and other caregivers imitate his loving care for his children. Being human, earthly parents cannot share in his omniscience or his infinite capacity for love. Mothers and fathers do the best that they can to provide for their children and to make wise decisions on their behalf. But they can fall short. They suffer from their human limits. In their failings, they show in reverse what God is: the perfect parent.



Learn About God's Love

- Talk with children about the picture.

2 Explore

Objective: To understand that God teaches how to love

Special People

Ask children how God shows his love for them. Possible responses: by making us, by giving us gifts and talents, by giving us families

Tell children that special people have taught them certain skills.

- Read aloud the text.
- Ask children why people who love them want to teach them new things. Possible responses: to share time with them, to show something that is important, to help children enjoy a hobby



Objective: To learn that each person is a child of God

God Shows Love

Remind children that God teaches us about love.

- Have children listen for how God shows love for us.
- Read aloud the text.
- Ask children to tell about people who love them. Possible responses: parents, siblings, neighbors, teachers, friends

Child of God

Proclaim the Scripture.

- Ask children what it means to be a child of God. Possible responses: God loves us; he will care for us; we are all brothers and sisters.
- Discuss the question.

SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND

John's Epistles This scripture verse is from the first letter of John. This letter is written in the style of the Gospel according to John and expands on many of the ideas contained in that Gospel.

- This verse affirms our status as children of God, as well as his love for us.
- The verse also challenges us to live in God's love in hope of achieving salvation.

OPTIONAL ACTIVITY

Children's Literature Read aloud *Big Brown Bear's Up and Down Day* by David McPhail (Harcourt, 2003).

This book demonstrates the love of friendship and can be a springboard for teaching about God's love for all of us.

3 Celebrate

Objective: To celebrate belief in God the Father

Let Us Pray

Tell children they will say what they believe.

Decorate the prayer space with family pictures.

- · Practice the response with children.
- Use the Call to Faith Kindergarten CD, Track 2, to rehearse the song.

Gather

Invite children to the prayer space.

 Ask children to hold hands and to bow their heads during the prayer celebration.

Pray

- Read aloud the leader's part, and have children pray the response.
- · Allow time for children to tell about their family pictures.
- · Conclude with the song.

I Believe Observant children will note that sometimes a children's Mass prayer begins with "I believe in God, the Father almighty."

- · Explain that this prayer tells what Catholics believe about God
- . Challenge children to listen to the Creed at Mass and to tell what they remember about the prayer. Some children may be able to memorize the first four lines of the Apostles' Creed.


