
Your journeys through life can be both exciting and scary. Journeys include both changes and challenges. Because there are often many unknowns, a journey can also include taking some risks.

Abram and Sarai's Journey



The risks involved in a journey are not so scary if you know that God is with you. Abram and Sarai learned that God was with them always. They remained faithful to God, and God blessed them.

SCRIPTURE

The Book of Genesis

Abram's Call

A bram and Sarai were getting old and had no children. One day God said to Abram, "Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you. I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you."

As God directed, Abram and Sarai took all of their possessions and set out for the land of Canaan. After traveling through the land to a sacred place, Abram had a vision of God, who said, "To your descendants I will give this land." So Abram built an altar there to honor God and continued on the journey with Sarai.



The Journey Continues

God appeared again to Abram and told him that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky and that they would have a land of their own. Although he had no children, Abram put his faith in God. God changed Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah as a sign of the covenant.

One day three men visited Abraham and Sarah. The couple quickly prepared a meal for their guests. The men told Abraham that Sarah would have a son, as God had promised. Sarah was listening and laughed to herself because she was too old to have children. But within a year Sarah did give birth to a son and named him Isaac, which means "one who laughs."

Focus What does it mean to have faith?

The faith journey that began with Abraham continued with his son Isaac and Isaac's son Iacob. It is from Iacob that the nation of Israel would take its name.



SCRIPTURE

The Book of Genesis

The Story of Joseph

n the Book of Genesis, Jacob was renamed Israel after wrestling with an angel. The name means "one who struggles with God."

Jacob became the father of twelve sons, but Joseph was his favorite. Joseph's brothers were jealous of him and plotted to get rid of him. They sold him to a caravan of travelers, and Joseph became a slave. Because he could interpret dreams, Joseph saved Egypt from starvation during a great famine. Joseph's brothers arrived in Egypt to buy food and were united with Joseph, who invited them to settle there.

God Invites

As seen through the faith stories of Abraham, Sarah, and their descendants, God keeps his promise of salvation.

You encounter God today through the Bible, the sacraments, and the Church. God's Son, Jesus, is the way of salvation for you. The Holy Spirit, whom Jesus sent, will help you on your faith journey. Wherever you go, God the Father is with you.

God invites you to respond to him in the same way that Abraham and Sarah did-with faith. This means that you freely choose to believe in God and all that God has revealed. When you respond to God with faith, you offer your heart and mind to him. You begin your own journey of faith, as Abraham and Sarah did. You have faith that God will guide you and keep his promises to you.

Words

Faith is believing in God and all that God has revealed. Faith is both a gift from God and a free choice

Prayer is raising your mind and heart to God. In prayer, you both listen and talk to God.

Faith and Prayer

God still speaks to people today, and people can communicate with God. This is done through prayer. Prayer begins and ends with listening to God. You can strengthen your faith with prayer, using one of these forms: blessing and adoration, petition for your own needs, intercession (praying for the needs of others), thanksgiving, or praise. You can take time to pray at any time throughout the day.

What are some ways to develop your prayer life?


An important way to develop your prayer life is to pray the types of prayers found in the Bible. Because the Bible is God's word to humans, it contains teaching on prayer that will help you grow as a Christian. The following examples of prayer will help strengthen your prayer life.

Forms of Prayer

Praise Through this form of prayer, you give God a big round of applause just because he is God.

 You give God praise for his friendship, his kindness, and his goodness. Intercession You use this form of prayer to pray for the Church or the whole world.

- · You also ask God to help someone.
- You intercede on behalf of others as Jesus intercedes for you with his Father.



- You might pray for God's mercy, forgiveness, and guidance when you are sad, sick, troubled, confused, or in a state of sin.
- You also ask God to help others.



Thanksgiving You express your gratitude to God for the good things in your life.

 When you experience some special cause for rejoicing, such as good grades or restored health or a wonderful day, you thank God for it.

Blessing and Adoration

- You bless God who blesses you. You also bless others who are made in God's image.
- A blessing is a prayer of response to God's gifts.
- Adoration is giving respectful homage to God by honoring the greatness of the Lord.
