The Death and Resurrection of Jesus

From the beginning of his public ministry Jesus challenged the religious leaders of his day to think about the true meaning of the Covenant that God had made with his people. Jesus expelled demons and forgave sins. Jesus healed on the Sabbath. He challenged the triviality of the endless number of man-made laws by preaching the Law of Love.

Jesus' teachings and actions eventually led to his Passion and death. The suffering of Jesus was not without purpose. Though Jesus was without sin, he suffered willingly for all of us. In accepting his death on a cross, Jesus placed his life in complete conformity with the divine plan. His Resurrection opened the way for us to new life. Joined to Christ and his death and Resurrection through our Baptism, we share in the Paschal Mystery and are empowered to live our new life in Christ.

Sharing Together

You can use the following questions to discuss what the children have read. Be sure to answer any questions the children may have. Remember that the responses given below are simply one way to express the main idea underlying the response to each question, so be sure to affirm all appropriate responses.

- What happened at Jesus' trial and death?
 (Pilate sentenced Jesus to death by crucifixion.
 Jesus was nailed to the cross and died on the cross.)
- What happened three days after Jesus died? (The tomb was empty. Jesus was raised from the dead. This is the Resurrection.)
- What is the Resurrection? (The Resurrection is Jesus rising from the dead on the third day after his death and burial.)
- How does the crucifix remind us of Jesus? (A crucifix has an image of Jesus' body on it. It reminds us that Jesus died on a cross.)
- What is the Ascension? (The Ascension is the return of the Risen Jesus to his Father in heaven.)

All Grades Ask the children to share one or two things that they learned from their reading.



Working Together

Choose one of the following activities to do together or design a similar activity of your own.

- Visit your church and pray the Stations of the Cross. Afterward, talk about how the Stations of the Cross tell the story of Jesus' Passion and death.
- Visit a few Catholic churches in your area and look at the Stations of the Cross. Compare the sacred art. Talk about how each set of Stations tells the story in a unique manner.
- The next time you take part in Mass, notice all the words and symbols of Jesus' death and Resurrection. After Mass share what you noticed with one another to discover the ways we remember Jesus' death and Resurrection during Mass.
- At Mass we pray aloud or sing the memorial acclamation "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." Throughout the week, sing together a memorial acclamation whenever you pray together as a family. You can use an acclamation melody sung by your parish or put the words to your own melody.

What Difference Does Faith Make?

Leader: lesus, the depth of your love for us is overwhelming. You gave your life for us. May our lives lead others to discover your love for them. In your name we pray.

All: Amen.

The Holy Spirit

The Scriptures tell us that Jesus' followers were filled with the Holy Spirit when they were gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem fifty days after the Ascension on the Jewish feast of Pentecost. That event, which includes the manifestation of the Holy Spirit in a strong wind and tongues of fire, empowered the disciples to proclaim the Good News. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the disciples followed Jesus' command to take his mission into the world.

The Holy Spirit sparks faith in the hearts of all who believe in Jesus Christ. We come to know and believe in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is our guide, our teacher, our advocate, our helper. The Holy Spirit blesses us with gifts and empowers us to live as followers of Jesus.



Baptism and Confirmation

Baptism is the first sacrament we celebrate and is closely related to Confirmation. Baptism is the entry door to life in the Church and is one of the three Sacraments of Christian Initiation. Through Baptism we are joined to Christ and become part of the Body of Christ, the Church.

At Baptism we make promises that we are to live out the rest of our lives. The Holy Spirit, whom we receive at Baptism, helps us live out the promises that we make. Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is always with us as our companion and guide.

- Why do we celebrate Baptism? (Through Baptism we are joined to Christ and become members of the Church. We receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Original sin and our personal sins are forgiven. We are reborn as children of God.)
- What are the words for Baptism?
 ("I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.")
- What does the sacrament of Confirmation celebrate? (Confirmation celebrates the Holy Spirit strengthening us to live as Christians.)
- What are the words for Confirmation?

 ("Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.")

All: Amen.



Eucharist and the Mass

The Second Vatican Council teaches that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. In celebrating the Eucharist we share in the Paschal Mystery of the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Iesus Christ.

At Mass we celebrate both the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. These two parts of the Mass are closely linked. In listening to and reflecting on the Scriptures, we are fed by God's word. In remembering the Last Supper, in participating in Jesus' loving self-sacrifice, and in sharing Holy Communion and being nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ, we are joined more fully to Christ and to one another and strengthened to live the Gospel. God's power through the Holy Spirit makes Iesus truly present for us under the appearances of bread and wine. The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

Celebrating the Eucharist each week with understanding and enthusiasm is an essential part of being Catholic. It is both a celebration of mystery and a source of unity among all Catholics.

Sharing Together

You can use the following questions to discuss what the children have read. Be sure to answer any questions the children may have. Remember that the responses given below are simply one way to express the main idea underlying the response to each question, so be sure to affirm all appropriate responses.

- Why do we gather for Mass? (We gather as the Church community for the celebration of Mass to listen to God's word and to praise and thank God.)
- What do we do during the Liturgy of the Word? (During the Liturgy of the Word, we listen to stories from the Bible: usually an Old Testament reading, a psalm, a New Testament reading, and a Gospel reading.)
- What happens during the Liturgy of the Eucharis?
 (We share in the Paschal Mystery of Christ, his Passion, death, Resurrection, and Ascension.
 The bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. We receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion.)
- How do we participate in the celebration of Mass? (We participate in Mass when we sing and say the responses. We stand or kneel. We pray. Joined to Christ, we offer ourselves to God. We share a sign of peace. We receive the Eucharist.)

All Grades Ask the children to share one or two things that they learned from their reading.



Working Together

Choose one of the following activities to do together or design a similar activity of your own.

- Saint Pius X had a special devotion to the Eucharist. Search your parish library, a public library, or the Internet to see if you can find out more about Saint Pius X.
- Before you take part in the celebration of Mass next weekend, together read the Gospel selection assigned for that Sunday. Talk about what this reading means for your family.
- Go together to see the tabernacle at your church, Explain that we believe that Christ is present in the Eucharist. We call the consecrated bread, or the Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament. We keep, or reserve, the Blessed Sacrament in a tabernacle to show our reverence and respect for the Eucharist and to be able to bring Holy Communion to those who are ill or elderly and cannot get to church for the celebration of Mass. Notice the lit candle near the tabernacle. It is called a sancturary lamp. It tells us that the Blessed Sacrament is in the tabernacle.

See how many of the liturgical ministers at Mass you can list. Your list might include priest, altar servers, readers or lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, greeters, ushers, sacristan, musicians, singers, and so on. Your parish might even have a liturgy planning team, a group that prepares the environment or a volunteer cleaning crew.
