Jesus spoke to Philip as they looked out at the huge crowd of people. The people had come to be with Jesus. There were thousands!


"Two hundred days of wages would not buy enough food!" Philip answered.


"A boy has five loaves of bread and two fish," Andrew said. "But that is nothing in this crowd."

Jesus took the bread and the fish. Looking up to heaven, he blessed and broke them. He gave them to the disciples for the people.



We Believe


- We are the People of God, the Church.
