
Unit 2 Opener

Teaching Tip

Sensitivity to Diversity. The faith life of the families of the children in your group, more than likely, is quite diverse. Some families may participate in the liturgy and the life of the Church on a very regular basis; others may participate mostly on special occasions, such as the Baptism of children, the marriage of family members, and so on. It is your responsibility to remind the children and their families of their obligation to take part in the celebration of Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. Be aware of this diversity as you call for a sharing of the children's faith experiences. Try to provide clear clues that will help the children respond to the questions.

GETTING READY

The "Getting Ready" page engages the children in sharing prior knowledge and aids you in planning your lessons to meet the needs of the children.

What I Have Learned

This section asks the children to share something they already know about liturgy and the sacraments of the Church, Read to the children the faith words and ask volunteers to share ideas they know about each concept.

Words to Know

This section is a quick assessment of the children's familiarity with some of the faith words they will be learning. Read each word to the group and have them put an X next to the faith words they know and a ? next to the words they need to learn more about. During the "Unit Review" the children will be asked to return to this page and once again share their understanding of the words.

A Question I Have

This section provides an opportunity for the children to ask questions that they have about forgiveness. Write their questions on a chart. As you work through the unit, always refer back to the chart and ask volunteers to answer the questions. This affirms for the children what they are learning about their faith.

A Scribture Story

This section uses an illustration from the Scripture story of the Last Supper to introduce a key Scripture story in this unit. Have the children look at the picture and answer the question.

We Worship God

Background

The Work of God

The meaning of the Greek word from which the English word liturgy derives means "a public work" or "a service on behalf of the people." The Church has adopted the word liturgy to name its participation in the work of God the Holy Trinity—one God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—among us in the sacraments. (See John 17:4.)

This work, which is the work of the whole Church, Christ the Head and all the members in unity with the Holy Spirit, gives honor and glory to the Father.

For it is the liturgy through which, especially in the divine sacrifice of the Eucharist, "the work of our redemption is accomplished," . . . and the faithful are enabled to express in their lives and manifest to others the mystery of Christ and the real nature of the true Church.

Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum concilium) 2

In every liturgical act of the Church, especially the celebration



of the Eucharist and the other sacraments, we join with Jesus Christ in giving praise to the Father in unity with the Holy Spirit. In the liturgy we not only remember the saving work of Christ, but we are made sharers in the Paschal Mystery of Christ's Passion, death, and glorious Resurrection.

The Presence of Christ with Us

In our work and worship as the Body of Christ, we join with Mary and all the saints and angels. We sing hymns and give praise to God the Father who makes all things new in Christ, sends us the gift of the Holy Spirit, and unites us as the People of God. We are given a taste of the heavenly banquet that awaits us at the end of this life's pilgrimage.

Jesus said, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). When the Church prays and celebrates, Christ is present. When we are baptized or forgiven or healed, it is

Christ who is truly acting. When we hear the Scriptures read in Church, it is Jesus himself who is present and speaking. Jesus is in our midst and with the grace of the Holy Spirit, we are transformed into the adopted sons and daughters of God the Father.

First Thoughts

Our Church Home

When taking part in Mass and other Church celebrations, we should feel at home and able to participate easily and comfortably. To do this we need to understand what is happening and what is expected of us. Teaching children the basic words and actions of Catholic worship will allow them to celebrate with joy rather than watch with anxiety.

The Language of the People

One of the characteristics of Catholic worship is the constancy of the words and actions from day to day and from place to place. As we attend different Catholic churches to



worship, we need to accept and appreciate the small differences, legitimately recognized by the Church, that "manifest the catholicity of the Church, because they signify and communicate the same mystery of Christ" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1208).

The Church Teaches.

The General Directory for Catechesis places great importance on liturgical formation.

Liturgical formation . . . must explain what the Christian liturgy is, and what the sacraments are. It must also however, offer an experience of the different kinds of celebration and it must make symbols, gestures, etc. known and loved. That is why Faith First includes liturgical celebrations and prayer experiences as a

regular part of its curriculum. See the Catechism . . .

National Directory for Catechesis

Implementing the National Directory for Catechesis: Learning by Heart. The National Directory teaches that memorizing important elements of our faith "not only deepens the common understanding of the faith but also forms an indispensable condition for living that faith" (NDC 29F, page 102). As you begin chapter 11, challenge the students to memorize the names of the seven sacraments, as well as a brief explanation of each of them, by the end of the unit. Create a poster chart listing each of the children's names so they can chart their progress.

Day 1

Teach

Ask a volunteer to read the "Faith Focus" question aloud and have the children think silently about how they might answer it. Tell them that these two pages will help them learn more about words and actions lesus used.

DISCOVER

- · Invite the children to look at the image on page 140 and share what they see.
- · Explain that the Scripture story of Jesus and Jairus's daughter is one example of how lesus used words and actions to do his saving work.
- · Read the story of lairus's daughter aloud.
- · Ask what action lesus used to make the little girl better. He took the girl's hand. What words did lesus say? "Little girl, I say to you, arise!"
- · Have a volunteer read the last paragraph on page [4]. Point out that the words and actions of Jesus were signs of God's love

Faith Focus

What do the words and actions of Jesus teach us?

Words and Actions of Jesus

Iesus used words and actions to show God's love for us. One time Jairus came to Jesus. We can read about Jairus and Iesus in Saint Mark's Gospel.

> lairus was a religious leader who had great faith in God. lairus asked lesus to help his daughter who was very sick. Read what happened next.

Jesus and his disciples followed Igirus to his house. When they arrived there, Jesus saw the family and neighbors weeping. He then took lairus and his wife and the disciples and entered the room where the child was, Jesus took her by the hand and said, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl got up immediately and walked around. And Iesus told her parents to give her something to eat. Based on Mark 5:22-24, 38, 41-43



Teaching Tip

Helpful Hints. The activity for this lesson is quite open-ended. Second graders may need some help brainstorming. Discuss some of the stories the students know about lesus' ministry. Write on the board the things lesus said or did in each story the children suggest. Narrow their brainstorm responses to a handful of ideas before having students complete the activity. They may refer to the ideas on the board when they share how lesus' actions helped them to believe and trust in God. They can discuss their ideas with a partner.



Background: Faith-Filled People

Saint Mark. Around the year A.D. 60, Saint Mark wrote a vivid account of the life and death of lesus. He wrote in Greek for the Gentiles who converted to Christianity. During that time the Church was enduring great persecution. The key points of Saint Mark's Gospel are an attempt to understand the humanity of Jesus and his suffering and death. Tradition says that Saint Mark died as a martyr in Alexandria, Egypt, The symbol of Saint Mark's Gospel is a winged lion. The lion is a desert animal that symbolizes the regal power of Christ. The feast of Saint Mark is celebrated on April 25.

Apply

REINFORCE

Have volunteers share three sentences that tell the beginning, the middle, and the end of the story. Ask volunteers to put the sentences on the board.

INTEGRATE

- Tell the children that their answers included both words and actions. Explain that the Church uses words and actions to worship God.
- Write the word worship on the board. Ask children to recall its meaning. Have the children read silently "The Church Uses Words and Actions" and underline the words that define worship.

The Church Uses Words and Actions

The Church celebrates too. We celebrate our faith in Jesus. We celebrate God's love for us. We celebrate our love for God. The Eucharist is the most important celebration of the Church.



God loves us very much. One way we celebrate our love for God is to worship him. Worship means to honor and love God above all else. Our words and actions tell God we believe in him, hope in him, and love him.

Faith Vocabulary

Worship. From the Middle English worshipe or worthiness, the term worship is used to denote being worthy of respect and honor. Hence, when we show honor and respect for the divinity of Jesus or the greatness of God, we take part in the act of expressing reverence in the form of worship. Worship can take many forms and usually includes devotion and ritual. The Catholic liturgy is the work of the people. The Mass includes the ritual of proclaiming God's Word and the celebration of the Eucharist.

When we worship God, we listen to him. We listen to his word to us. We give adoration to God and praise him. We pray aloud and we sing. We stand and sit and walk in procession.

Teaching Tip

Challenging Questions. Children sometimes ask challenging questions. It is perfectly acceptable to tell the children you are not sure of an answer but that you will be glad to find out the answer for them. This models what they will often have to do in life. After you find the answer, share your findings with the children and explain where you found it, such as from your pastor, religious education director, the Catechism of the Catholic Church or the New Catholic Encyclopedia. Make sure all print sources have the Nihil Obstat and Imprimatur, which affirm that the materials are free of doctrinal or moral error

Blessing Prayers. One way we can help the children grow to know God's love for them is by praying a prayer of blessing for them. Remind the children that the priest at the end of Mass asks God to bless us. Before dismissing the children, pray this prayer of blessing with your hands folded together:

The Lord bless you and keep you!

The Lord let his face shine upon you and be gracious to you!

The Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace!

End by having the students pray the words and actions of the Sign of the Cross.

Teaching Tip

Using Sacramentals. The use of sacramentals at home is not as widespread as it was in the past. For example, holy water fonts at the doorways of rooms, crucifixes on display, and the Rosary prayed together every evening or once a week were more common than they are now. Display and use sacramentals during your sessions. Especially use the sacramentals that are used in the liturgical celebrations of the Church.



Liturgy Tip

Gestures in Prayer. When we pray, we use gestures that express our reverence toward God. Special meaning is given to our prayers when we use gestures such as folded hands, bowing, and genuflecting. Have the children name gestures they use when they pray. List them on the board and add some of your own. Then have the children tell when or with what prayers they use gestures. Write their responses next to the gestures on the list.
