God Strengthens Us to Be Holy

Goals

The children will learn about their obligation as Christians to live like Jesus, loving God and others. They will be encouraged to appreciate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, the Eucharist, and the Ten Commandments.

5 We Are Called to Follow lesus

Jesus teaches us how to live. He shows love and concern for others by healing them, forgiving them, and teaching them. He prays to his Father and teaches us the Lord's Prayer. In this chapter the children are encouraged to follow the path of Jesus and to make prayer and good works part of their daily lives.

6 Jesus Invites Us to Receive God's Mercy

We are all sinners and in need of God's mercy. In this chapter the children are helped to recognize both their need for mercy and God's readiness to grant it if they are sorry for their sins. They learn about conscience and the importance of forming it according to Jesus' teachings so that their consciences may help direct and evaluate their choices. They study the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation as a means of overcoming weaknesses and learning to love God more.

7 We Worship God

As creatures of God, we acknowledge our Creator through worship. In this chapter the children learn that they can worship God through loving adoration and service. They learn that Jesus offered perfect worship to the Father, and they unite themselves with him. They also learn from the example of the saints how they can use their unique gifts for the worship of God.

8 God Gave Us Laws for Living

In the Old Testament God gave his people the Ten Commandments as a pattern for living. The children learn that these laws are a sign of God's love. They are encouraged to recognize the commandments as a guide to a rich, happy life on earth and eternal joy in heaven. The children are motivated to love these laws of love as the Israelites did.

9 We Honor Mary

In Mary we find the model for all we are meant to be. Her assent to God's will in the Annunciation is characteristic of the holiness to which we are called. The children learn the Angelus and review the key concepts of this unit.

Reflecting

The love of God the Father becomes visible in Jesus. The Gospels show Jesus meeting each person's needs, responding to each one's unique dignity and calling each to live more fully in his love. God's love for us asks for nothing less than a total response: We are to share that love with each person we encounter in our daily lives. Christ asked his Father "that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them." (John 17:26)

Jesus tells us that we are to share God's goodness with all. We are to love one another with the power we receive from him:

His divine power has bestowed on us every-thing that makes for life and devotion, through the knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and power. Through these, he has bestowed on us the precious and very great promises, so

that through them you may come to share in the divine nature, after escaping from the corruption that is in the world because of evil desire. For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, virtue with knowledge, knowledge with self-control, self-control with endurance, endurance with devotion, devotion with mutual affection, mutual affection, mutual affection with lowe.

2 Peter 1:3-7

At each Eucharist we express our willingness to die with Christ so that others might live. In the opening prayer of liturgies and at pastoral or spiritual meetings, the Church prays for Christlike love:

- 1. Direct the children to the picture on page 27.
 - + What is the boy in the photo trying to do? (climb the rope)
 - + What does he need to get to the top? (strength)
 - * We also need strength to be followers of lesus and live holy lives. Who gives us strength? (God)
 - + Have a volunteer read the unit title.
- 2. Recall the last unit.

What is the best way God reveals himself and speaks to us? (through Jesus)

- 3. Ask a child to read the paragraph of Jesus Teaches Us How to Live on page 29.
 - + This year you will be learning more about what it means to follow Jesus.
 - + Read the quotation from John's Gospel silently. Now let's read it together. [Read it.]
 - + Just as Jesus came to give us life, we too must be life-giving.
 - + Today's story tells of a father who felt very sad because his daughter had died. You will find out a little later just what lesus did.

Sharing

- 1. Discuss with the children ways in which they can work with Jesus to help people in today's world. * Solidarity
 - + We are going to read a story today about a very special lifegiving thing Jesus did. Because he was the Son of God, Jesus did many things for the people he met. We are not able to do all that Jesus did, but we can help people in our world by praying for them and asking Jesus to help them. When do people need our prayers? (when they are sad and have troubles; when they find it hard to be good; when they need food, clothing, or a home) Do you know any people who need our prayers? What could we ask Jesus to do for them?
 - We can make sacrifices for people. That means we can give our own things or our time, out of love for God, to those in need. Our sacrifices can even help people who live far away. How can they help? (Money, clothes, and food help missions and other groups who work to help people in need.)
 - The Poor and Vulnerable
 - + What kind words can we say to help people feel happy? (hello; thank you; please; I'm sorry; you did well; may I help you?)



We Are Called to Follow Jesus

Jesus Teaches Us How to Live

During his lifetime in Palestine, Jesus showed us how to be the best persons we can be. By his words and actions he taught us how to live holy and happy lives. Baptized Christians try to live like Jesus and follow his teachings. We are called to bring his life and love into the world. Jesus said,

> "I came that you might have life-and have it to the full."

> > adapted from John 10:10



- + What kind deeds can you do for others? (run errands; carry things; put things away at home; ask another child to play; help someone who got hurt; give a card or gift to a sick person) You can see that there are many things we can do. The important thing is to do them. There are some people who spend their lives helping others, as Jesus did. Do you know some of them? (doctors, nurses, priests, sisters, brothers, deacons, lay missionaries, teachers, research scientists, volunteers)
- 2. Tell the children that there are three things everyone can do for others: pray, sacrifice, and help. List these words on the board.
- 3. Ask the children how they can pray, sacrifice, or help in a situation in the news or at

List their suggestions on the board under the proper headings.

- 4. Introduce the children to the people in the illustration on page 30. (Jesus, Jairus [JIE ruhs], Jairus's wife and daughter)
- 5. Let the children read the story of Jairus called Jesus Showed Love and Concern.
 - + Jairus knew that Jesus would help him. Even though his little girl was dead. Jairus still went to Jesus. How did Jesus help Jairus? (He brought the little girl back to
 - + Responding to the needs of others brings them and us joy. Recall all the ways we talked about earlier that we can work with Jesus to help people in today's world.
- Discuss prayer for others in trouble. * Solidarity
 - + We give our first love and concern to our own families. However, as Christians we must be concerned about everyone. We are all brothers and sisters.
 - * What should we do when we hear about disasters and tragedies? (pray for the people concerned; help in some way, if possible)
 - + Do you remember a time when you prayed or helped people suffering from a disaster even though you did not know them personally?

Acting

- 1. Encourage the children to pray daily for the special people in their lives.
 - + Jairus asked Jesus to help his daughter. We can be like Jairus and ask God to bless those we love. Do you pray every day for your parents? [Pause.] You could decide right now for whom you will pray every day. [Pause.] When will you pray for them-as soon as you get up or just before you go to bed? Setting a definite time to ask God to bless those we love helps us remember better.

Jesus Showed Love and Concern

A man named Jairus rushed through the crowd to reach Jesus. He knelt before Jesus and said, "My daughter has just died. But come, lay your hand on her, and she will live."

Jesus went with Jairus to his house. He took the little girl by the hand, and she got up. Jesus gave life back to her. Jairus and the girl's mother were filled with joy.

Before You Begin

- 1. When Jesus forgave the sins of a paralyzed man, Jewish leaders challenged him by protesting, "Who but God alone can forgive sins?" (Mark 2:7) Jesus gave them a visible sign of his divine power by curing the man's body so that the man was able to get up, pick up his stretcher, and walk away.
- 2. There is an interesting difference between the Lord's Prayer in Matthew's Gospel and the one in Luke's Gospel. The text in Matthew reads: "forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors." The text in Luke reads: "forgive us our sins for

we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us." The Matthean version seems to imply that we ask for the same degree of forgiveness that we extend to others. The Lucan text seems to say that we ask for forgiveness because we have earned the right to do so by forgiving others. In either case, it is clear that lesus wants us to ask for God's forgiveness, and he also wants us to be forgiving people. Forgiving and forgiven-the two cannot be separated. It is by forgiving others that we open ourselves up to God's forgiveness. Both Matthew and Luke would agree on that.

Centering

- 1. Let the children share their experiences of being forgiven and forgiving others.
 - + When we are forgiven, many wonderful things happen. Do you remember a time when someone said to you, "That's OK. I forgive you." How did you feel?
 - + How did you feel when you said to someone, "I forgive you" or "That's OK"?
 - + Forgiveness always makes us feel good. It makes us want to do the right thing the next time. When we forgive others, we heal hurts. It's like giving a dying plant the water and sun it needs to become strong and healthy again. Forgiving is like giving life back to people.
 - + What story did you read recently about giving life? (the raising of Jairus's daughter)
 - + What did you learn you could do to be life-giving? (pray, sacrifice, help)

- 2. Introduce the story of the paralyzed man.
 - + Today you will read another story that teaches us a way to give life. It is about a man who is paralyzed. [Print paralyzed on the
 - + What does paralyzed mean? (not being able to move, either partially or totally)

Sharing

1. Direct the children to read **Jesus' Forgiving Love** Healed People on page 31. Have several volunteers read the paragraphs and one child read Jesus'

2. Check the children's

understanding of the story. + How do you know that the

- paralyzed man had good friends? (They brought him to Jesus by letting the man down through the roof.) When they brought him to Jesus, what was the first thing Jesus did? (forgave the man's sins)
- · Why did Jesus forgive the man's sins before he healed him? (to show that God forgives sins; to show that being forgiven is more important than being able to walk, to show that forgiveness is a kind of healing)
- We can't work a miracle as lesus did, but we can forgive people who hurt us or make us angry.
- 3. BLM 8 Use the BLM 8 Puppet Pattern to create puppets.
 - + Let the children create characters with their puppets and use them to act out situations in which the children handle angry feelings in a Christian way. Say:
 - + I will start several plays, and you may finish each one. Think about the feelings each puppet has. Think of ways the puppets can tell how they feel and still bring the peace of forgiveness to each other. Raise your hand when you are ready to end the play. We can have several endings for each play.
 - 1. Cesar sat next to Nathan on the bus. He said unkind things about Luis. Luis heard the boys talking and felt hurt and very angry. Nathan got off the bus, and Cesar watched Luis going through his baseball cards. He asked Luis if he could see them.

Jesus' Forgiving Love Healed People

One day Jesus was teaching in a house. Ma people gathered to hear him speak. They crowded into the house and around the door.

In the crowd was a paralyzed man who wanted to see Jesus. Because the man couldn't get into the house, his friends carried him to the roof. They lifted up part of the roof until they had a large opening. Then they lowered the sick man on his mat

Jesus stopped teaching. He looked at the sick man and said, "Child, your sins are forgiven." Then he cured the man's body. The man got up, picked up his mat, and walked out in front of everyone.



Jesus Prayed to His Father

The apostles watched Jesus when he was at prayer. They could see that he how to speak to God our Father. Afterward they came to him and said, "Lord, teach us to pray."

Then Jesus taught them the prayer we call the Lord's Prayer or the Our Father. We should try to pray it every day. In this prayer we praise God and ask for all our needs. We ask to be forgiven as we forgive others. We also ask to be saved from evil.

- 3. Angelo didn't follow Tyler's instructions and broke Tyler's kite when he used it. Tyler felt angry, but Angelo said he was very sorry and would be much more careful in the future. Now he wants to try out Tyler's new model airplane.
- 4. Elena feels bad because she can't draw as well as her brother Salvador can. Salvador boasts about the contests he's won, and he teases Elena about her drawings. One day Elena tears up one of Salvador's pictures. Now both children feel angry.

- 4. Read the paragraphs in Jesus Prayed to His Father on page 31.
 - . Then have the children look at the picture.
- + Who are the men standing in the background? (apostles)
- + What are they doing? (watching Jesus pray)
- + Jesus looked so happy and peaceful. He was speaking to his heavenly Father and nothing else seemed to matter.
- + What did the apostles want to do when they saw Jesus praying? (They wanted to pray like Jesus.) What did they say to Jesus? ("Lord, teach us to pray.")

+ lesus wanted his apostles to

know his Father and speak to him freely and easily. What prayer did Jesus teach them? (the Lord's Praver)

Acting

- 1. Play a song about forgiveness and peace.
 - + Tell the children to think of Jesus forgiving the man who is paralyzed as they listen.
 - + Play the song again and invite the children to sing along.
- Lead the children in a litany asking to be more forgiving.
 - ♦ Ask the children to think of a hurt that's hard to forgive. Let those who wish to do so add their petitions to the petitions below. For each petition, the children may respond, "Lord, help us forgive."
 - * When people say mean things to us ...
 - + When we are teased or laughed
 - . End the litany by praying the Lord's Prayer together.

Before You Begin

We pray the Lord's Prayer, also commonly referred to as the Our Father, with the knowledge that our loving, just, and merciful God listens to his children. God gives us what we ask, providing even more than we request. In our prayer we express our reverence and let God

know that we are one with him in will and desire. We ask God to meet our earthly and spiritual needs, and we pray for God's forgiveness for our thoughtlessness and deliberate sins, stating our willingness to forgive others. Finally, we ask God to deliver us from temptation and evil, knowing that God will give us strength by responding to our plea with guidance and loving concern.

Centering

- 1. Recall the last lessons.
 - What have you learned that followers of Jesus should try to do to be like him? (show love and concern, bring life, forgive)
 - Today you will learn something else from lesus.
- Lead the children to discover that we can learn how to pray by watching others at prayer.
- → Have you ever watched your parents, teachers, or someone else at prayer and wondered what they were saying?
 - ◆ There's a story of a priest who saw a workman come into his church every evening. The priest watched the man and wondered what he was saying to God. One day the priest waited for him outside the church door. He greeted the man and then asked, "Why do you come to the church every day?" The man said, "Well, I. talk to him." "What do you say?" questioned the priest." I say 'Hello' and then he looks at me, and I look at him."
 - That workman shows us how easy it is to pray. Jesus made it easier for us to speak to God by teaching us a prayer. Do you remember what prayer Jesus taught his apostles and us? (the Lord's Prayer)

Sharing

- 1. Discuss phrases of the Lord's Praver.
 - + By what name does Jesus call God? (Our Father)
 - + Why is God our Father? (God takes care of us. We are God's children. God has given us everything we have.)
 - + In the Lord's Prayer what do we sav about where God is? (who art in heaven)
 - + What does "hallowed be thy name" mean? (We want God's name to be kept holy.)
 - + How do we show reverence for God's name? (by never speaking it when we are angry; by using it in prayer; by speaking of God with love)
 - + What is the next part of the prayer? ("Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.") We pray that all people will belong to God's kingdom. We pray that God will rule in the kingdom of our hearts. We want all people on earth to do God's will, just as all those in heaven do it

- + What is the next part of the Lord's Prayer? ("Give us this day our daily bread.") What are we asking from God? ("our daily bread") Bread is a symbol of all that we need in our lives. We are asking for food, clothing, and shelter. We also are asking for the Bread we need in order to grow in God's life-Holy Communion.
- ♦ What is the next phrase? ("Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.") What are trespasses? (sins) Trespass also can mean any hurtful or mean action. Because we are not God, others cannot sin against us in the same way as they do against God. What must we do if we want God to forgive us? (forgive those who trespass against us)
- What else do we ask of God? ("Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.") God allows us to be tempted but gives us strength not to give in. We ask God to keep us from evil and to help us be holy.

2. Recall the value of the Lord's Prayer.

- + Gordie Howe, who is in the Hockey Hall of Fame, is considered one of the greatest players in the history of professional hockey. Gordie played the rough game of hockey for more than 30 years, and before every game he prayed the Lord's Prayer to ask God to keep the players on both teams safe.
- + Why do you suppose he chose to pray the Lord's Prayer? (It is the prayer Jesus gave to us.)
- + What part of the Lord's Prayer means the most to you?
- + Think about this, but you don't need to answer out loud. When will you pray the Lord's Prayer?

3. Direct the children to work the Lord's Prayer activity on page 32 and check their answers.

4. Divide the children into groups.

- + Give each group drawing paper and a phrase of the Lord's Prayer to print and illustrate; one group can design a cover and another an Amen page.
- + Tell the children the book will be in the classroom for them to use at any time.

Before You Begin

- 2. Contrast Jesus' compassion for Bartimaeus with the attitude of the people who tried to quiet him.
 - + The people around him heard Bartimaeus cry for help and were annoved. In fact, they tried to make him be quiet. They didn't care about helping him. How do you think that made Bartimaeus feel?
 - + Why didn't Jesus act the way other people did?
- 3. Have the children read People Who Act Like Jesus and work page 33.

Explain to them that all of the people in the examples cared about others, but they showed it in different ways depending on their situations.

- 4. Ask the children to unscramble the word PLHE on the board.
 - ♦ When you unscramble the word, you will find out what you should do whenever you see anyone in need, (HFLP)
 - Then ask them to think of ways to help that begin with each letter in the word help. (Examples: Hold the door open. Empty the wastebasket, Listen. Pray.) & Solidarity
