

Hope

When we hope, we place our trust in God. We know that God always keeps his word. God always keeps his promises.





Veronica and Simon

Do you remember the story of Jesus carrying his cross? The story is retold prayerfully in the Stations of the Cross. You can find the Stations of the Cross in your parish church. Here is part of that story.

As Jesus walked up the hilly streets of Jerusalem, he stumbled and fell to the ground three times. There was a man named Simon in the crowd who saw Jesus fall. Simon reached down, picked up the cross, and helped Jesus carry it. He had come to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover.

Veronica and other women disciples of Jesus were there too. As Jesus walked by, Veronica offered Jesus a cloth to wipe the

sweat and blood from his face. Jesus saw that she and the other women were worried about him. He told them not to worry. Jesus' words to the women gave them hope.

The Paschal Mystery

Jesus' last meal with his disciples was the Passover meal. We call this meal the Last Supper.

After the meal ended, Jesus went to a garden near Jerusalem. There Judas, one of the Apostles, betraued Jesus. He brought Jewish leaders and temple quards to Jesus. Judas kissed Jesus. This signaled the guards to arrest Jesus.

The leaders took Jesus to the Roman governor, Pontius Pilate. Pilate questioned Jesus but could not find Jesus guilty of any crime. But Pilate ordered that Jesus be put to death on a cross because the crowds demanded it.

The soldiers mocked Jesus and placed a crown of thornu branches on his head. After the soldiers beat him, they led Jesus to a place called Golgotha. There they nailed him onto a cross. Before he died, Jesus said,

"Father, forgive them." At about three o'clock in the afternoon, Jesus said in a loud voice, "Father, I now give myself to you."

BASED ON LUKE 23:26, 33-34, 44, 46

Jesus' death on the cross is called the Crucifixion. Jesus freely made a sacrifice of his life out of love to save all people from their sin.

Paschal Mystery

The Suffering, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ is known as the Paschal Mystery.





Faith-Filled People

Joseph of Arimathea

Joseph of Arimathea was a disciple of Jesus. After Jesus died, he asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Joseph helped place Jesus' body in a newly made tomb in the side of a mountain. It was a tomb Joseph had made for himself.

Jesus Rises to New Life

After Jesus died and was buried, his disciples thought they had lost him forever. Three days later, they heard some amazing news. They learned that Jesus was alive. He had risen from the dead. Here is what Matthew's Gospel describes:

Three days later, some women who were disciples of Jesus went to the tomb where the body of Jesus was placed. When the women arrived at the tomb and looked into it, they did not see Jesus' body. It was not there. An angel said to them, "God has raised Jesus from the dead! He is not here. Go and tell the other disciples to go to Galilee and wait there. Jesus will meet them there."

BASED ON MATTHEW 27:59-60; 28:1, 5-7

This event is called the Resurrection. It is the heart of the Church's faith in Jesus.

Jesus Returns to His Father

The Risen Jesus stayed with his disciples for forty days. During that time, he appeared to his disciples many times. When it was time for him to return to his Father in Heaven,

Jesus blessed his disciples and sent them to share the Good News with the whole world. Then the Risen Jesus returned to Heaven.

BASED ON LUKE 24:50-51

We call Jesus' return to his Father the Ascension. The word "ascension" means "a rising up."

The Suffering, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus is called the **Paschal Mystery**. The Paschal Mystery is Jesus' passing over from death to a new and glorified life.

Because of the Paschal Mystery, we hold up the promise of everlasting life. We can hope that after we die, we will live forever with God, the angels, Mary, and all the saints in happiness with God.

Catholics Believe

The Apostles' Creed

The Apostles' Creed passes on to us the faith of the Apostles. In the Apostles' Creed, we profess that Jesus descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into Heaven.
