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# Jesus Calls Us to Give Ourselves in Love

## Goals

The children will desire to follow Jesus' laws of love.

They will understand what the commandments require of them.

#### 5 Jesus Shows Us How to Love God Our Father

Jesus, through his loving response to his Father in all things, shows us how we can find God's loving care in everything that happens. The children learn how they can follow Christ and express their love for the Father by praying, speaking of him with love, and keeping Sunday holy.

#### 6 Jesus Shows Us How to Love Others

Jesus, who calls us to love others as he has loved us, shows us that love consists of listening to God our Father and using our gifts to bring his joy and peace to others. The children learn that their actions toward others are also directed to God and are led to reach out to others with love by working on special projects. In this way, they use their gifts to respond to the needs of others.

#### 7 We Give Love to Others

We follow Christ's way of love when we are courteous, honest, and true. The children reflect on how they can bring God's love to others and are invited to respond to God's love by promising to follow Jesus.

## 8 Jesus Calls Us to Live in Love

The children review the commandments. In a celebration, they are encouraged to commit themselves to follow Jesus Christ.

# Reflecting on the Faith Experience

Take a few moments to reflect prayerfully before preparing the lesson.

## Listening

"[T]he world must know that I love the Father and that I do just as the Father has commanded me."

John 14:31

## Reflecting

Love for his Father always inspired Jesus to do the things that pleased him. Jesus' mission on earth was to show us the Father's love and to bring us to him. Jesus showed us how to keep the Father's Word and how to pray. Above all, prayer is listening to God. It is a total receptivity to God, no matter how God decides to speak to us. Prayer strengthens our relationship with God. If prayer extends through our whole life, we will find God at the center of each joy and sorrow, each anxiety and pain. A prayerful attitude makes us aware of what the Lord has done for us and prompts us to exclaim with Mary:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior."

Luke 1:46-47

The Christian life consists of listening and responding to God as Jesus taught. To live as a Christian is to hear the divine Word at every moment and in every event, in both the simple and the complex realities of life. It is to believe that the Father's love is at work in everything and to return his love by doing the things that please him. As we follow Christ, we experience the joy that comes from above, the joy that no one can take from us.

Our daily prayer is a continuation of the gift of love we offer to the Father at each Mass. Celebrations of the Eucharist enable us to give ourselves in response to the goodness of the Lord. During the Mass, we honor God, who has given us all that we are and all that we have. As we praise God's name for that love, our lives are shaped by Christ's gift of himself, which unites us to God and to one another. United with the Lord Jesus, our lives become a living fulfillment of Paul's advice to the Ephesians:

[A]ddressing one another [in] psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father

Ephesians 5:19-20

## **Before You Begin**

Saint Augustine said that every Christian ought to be an alleluia from head to toe. Everything and everyone around us invites us to rejoice before God, to make our lives a celebration of God, culminating in an eternal celebration. Through his loving response to his Father, Iesus showed us how to live the first three commandments.

This is a special year in your child's faith development. Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation will offer an opportunity to introduce new concepts and develop your child's relationship with God in exciting new ways


As part of this preparation, Unit Two introduces the children to the Ten Commandments. They will discover how the first three commandments ask us to express our love for God as Jesus did: by praying to God, by speaking of him with love, and by keeping the Sabbath holy. The unit continues with discussions of the remaining seven commandments, which focus on loving others as Jesus does.

The children are presented with the simple ideas in each commandment, learning that they are to pray (1st Commandment), to honor God's name (2nd Commandment), to keep the Sabbath (3rd Commandment), to obey (4th Commandment), to be kind (5th Commandment), to be respectful (6th and 9th Commandments), to be honest (7th and 10th Commandments), and to be truthful (8th

## Centering

- 1. Discuss the picture of the children on page 29 and explore the meaning of celebrate.
  - + What are the children in the picture doing? (celebrating a birthday)
  - + How do you celebrate your birthday?
  - + What else do you celebrate besides birthdays? (New Year's Day, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter)
  - + When we celebrate, we show all the joy that is inside us. What do you do to show your joy at a celebration? (smile, laugh, sing, dance, clap, play, cheer)
- 2. Recall the last lesson.
  - + Why is Jesus God's best gift to us? (Jesus taught us how to live. He died and rose to give us new life.)
  - + Jesus told us how to live so that we are always full of joy. In this lesson, you will learn about what lesus said.

## Sharing

- 1. Ask a child to read aloud Iesus Loved God His Father on page 29.
  - + What did Jesus say would bring us joy? (living in his love; keeping his commandments)
  - + God made us to be people who celebrate. God made us to love and be joyful and to celebrate his love. God put a secret deep within us. The secret is that we can be happy when we love and celebrate God. Jesus knew this. That's why he said that the greatest commandment is to love God, lesus said, "The Lord our God is Lord alone! So love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength."
- 2. Help the children understand how Jesus celebrated his Father's love.
  - lesus had a special love for God. He knew him as a loving Father, and he called him Abba, which means "Father" in Hebrew.
  - + Once lesus spoke about how he loved his Father. He said, "Everyone must know that I love the Father because I am doing exactly what the Father told me."
  - + What did lesus do because he loved his Father? (He did what his Father told him.)
  - + Jesus saw God's love in everything. The birds and flowers made by God were in God's loving care. People shared in his Father's love. So lesus celebrated when he looked at people and animals and all of creation. He loved them all too.
  - + Sometimes things happened that made Jesus suffer. Jesus knew that his Father loved him even during those times. He knew that after the pain would come the celebration in heaven, where there would be only joy.
- 3. Explain that Jesus wants us to love and celebrate God.



# **Jesus Shows Us How to Love God Our Father**

#### Jesus Loved God His Father

We like to celebrate. God made us to celebrate his love. He made us to love and be joyful. lesus said:

"Live in my love. Keep my commandments. Then my joy will be in you, and your joy will be full." adapted from John 15:10-11

God gave us the Ten Commandments. They are rules that help us live as his children. When we follow God's rules, we are happy-

- + Jesus knows that loving is the most important thing we can do. He wants us to love and celebrate God our Father. Who knows why? (God loves us.)
- + When we say that we celebrate God, what we really mean is that we love God with our whole heart, soul, and all that we are, and that makes us really happy.
- 4. Invite the children to celebrate by creating a dance. You might want to use a song such as "Celebrate God" from Hi God!
- 5. Share with the children Jesus' love for speaking with his Father in prayer.

- lesus' friends knew that lesus had a special love for God his Father. They could tell by the way Jesus talked to his Father when he prayed. They even asked Jesus to teach them how to pray.
- · What prayer did Jesus teach them? (the Lord's Prayer; the Our Father)
- + Did you ever enjoy company you had in your home so much that at bedtime you wanted to stay up and visit some more instead of going to bed?
- lesus loved to talk and listen to his Father so much that sometimes he was up all night in prayer.

- 6. Describe the love with which Jesus spoke about God.
  - + Jesus loved his Father so much that he always wanted to tell people about him. Whenever he spoke about his Father, he spoke with such love that those who heard him speak knew he loved God.
  - + Jesus said "hallowed be thy name" when he was talking about God. He taught those who wanted to know how to pray to say it too. What was lesus saying about God's name? (It is holy.)
  - + Jesus wanted everyone to say God's name with love and to speak of God always with love. Sometimes people say "God" when they are angry, sad, or surprised. Why isn't this showing love for God? (It is using God's name for something other than love. It is not saying the name in prayer. It is not using it for talking about God. It is using the name carelessly.)
- 7. Ask volunteers to read the first three paragraphs of Jesus Pleased His Father on page 30.
- 8. Help the children understand why we celebrate on Sunday.
  - + Jesus celebrated his love for his Father in a special way on Saturday, Jesus was Jewish, and Jewish people celebrate Saturday as the Lord's Day, a day to remember God's goodness and special love.
  - + God's people have always celebrated or kept a day holy for the Lord.
  - + What day do we keep holy? (Sunday)
  - \* We keep Sunday as the Lord's Day because lesus rose from the dead on a Sunday.
  - + Catholic Christians do something on this day or on the evening before to keep it holy and special. Do you know what it is? (gather together to remember lesus at a special celebration, the Mass)

## Jesus Pleased His Father

Jesus loved his Father very much. He always did what pleased his Father.

Jesus loved talking to him. He heard his Father speaking to him in everything.

- + It is wrong to miss Sunday Mass unless you have a good reason such as illness, bad weather, or no one to take you.
- + We can also try to make Sunday special by praying and trying to spread God's love and joy to others.
- 9. Read the rest of page 30 aloud to the children

Talk about what lesus is doing in each picture. (praying, teaching, going to the Temple)

- 10. Read aloud the first paragraph of We Celebrate God's Love on page 31.
  - + How are the people in the picture celebrating God? (They are celebrating Mass together.)
  - + Why do we rest from hard work on Sunday? (It is a day reserved for God.)
- 11. Have the children fill in the blanks. Then read the rest of the page aloud.
  - + Jesus wants us to keep the Ten Commandments. The words on the hearts are key words for the first three commandments. which you have learned about today. They tell us how to love God
  - ♦ Commandments are like laws or rules. They are given to us by God to help us live good lives and be happy.

#### Acting

- 1. Invite the children to draw a picture of how they can celebrate God.
- Pray the Our Father together.
  - + The Our Father is inside the front cover of your book. Sometimes we call it the Lord's Prayer.
  - + Remember, when you know the Our Father by heart, you may color the cross by it.
  - + You can also find the Our Father, or Lord's Prayer, on page T415.
- 3. Point out the parent letter on page 28.
  - ◆ Tell the children that the letter explains what they are learning in this unit.
  - + Help them tear out the page and have them take it home for their parents to read.

## **Before You Begin**

- 1. Many people today lack the conscious relationship with God that lies at the heart of true Christian faith. To live in communion with God is to enjoy God's presence in the midst of everyday life, to perceive God's love at work in everything that happens. It is to respond to God with one's whole being by doing the things that please him. True prayer unites our thoughts and feelings, our insights and decisions, with the all-loving plan of God. Prayer of the heart and formal prayer help us to realize that God is taking loving care of us throughout the day. Daily prayer brings us into communion with God.
- 2. Plan and arrange a prayer corner in your classroom. Decide with the children where it should be and what would make it a special place for prayer. Encourage the children to make a prayer corner at home too.
- 3. During A Moment with Jesus, it is essential to maintain a quiet, reflective atmosphere.

## Centering\_

- 1. Challenge the children to find the three hearts that you have hidden in the room.
  - Ask the children to read the words written on each heart.
  - ♦ Have the children tell what each word means.
- 2. Link this lesson to the last one.
  - + Jesus told us to keep his commandments to be happy. Who remembers what was the most important thing he commanded us to do? (Love the Lord your God with all your heart.)
  - + What were the three things Jesus did to show his love for the Father? (prayed, spoke of him with love, celebrated the Lord's Day)
  - + We can show love for God in the same three ways. Today you will discover more about the first way: praying.

## Sharing

- 1. Show the children the prayer book or missal and discuss different ways of praying.
  - + Prayers that are written down sometimes say just what we want to say to God. Turn to the front and back covers of your book. What do you see? (prayers) Can you name some of them? Which ones have you already prayed?
  - + There are many different ways of praying. How have we prayed during our religion class? (A Moment with Jesus, special prayers such as the Sign of the Cross and the Our Father, prayer services)
  - + How do we pray during Mass? (aloud in the responses, silently,

- 2. Share your convictions about the value of daily prayer.
  - Tell the children when you pray, how you pray, and how prayer helps vou.
  - Ask the children to name other times or places to pray.

#### 3. Have the children talk about the illustration with We Can Pray to God Every Day on page 32.

- + What are some of the beautiful things in this picture?
- + Wouldn't it be nice if you could be there near the mountains and the waterfall? Draw yourself into the picture. Remember that you are also part of God's beautiful creation. [Play music as the children work.)
- + What might you be thinking as you look at the mountains, the sky, the waterfall, and the stream running through the valley?

#### 4. Introduce Psalm 139 and then read the adaptation on page 32.

- + A psalm is one of the prayersongs written by King David and others long ago. lesus prayed the psalms. Jewish people and Christians pray psalms today.
- + Follow along in your books as I read the words of Psalm 139.

#### 5. Guide the children in discussing the psalm.

- ♦ Where is God? (everywhere)
- When is God with us? (at all times)
- + What does God know about you? (everything)
- + Where does God go with you? (everywhere)
- + What are some things you do during the day?
- + What is God doing while you do these things? (watching over me; loving me)
- + God is with us everywhere, God is within us. God came to live in us in a special way when he gave us a share in his life.
- + God helps us think of him when we look at the beautiful mountains, the blue sky, and the cool streams.

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#### 6. Lead the children in prayer.

- Invite the children to sit quietly and close their eyes as you read A Moment with lesus.
- · Read the reflection slowly and reverently, pausing after each sentence.
- · When the children are ready, invite them to open their eyes and just relax quietly for a short time.

- 7. Discuss with the children different times and ways they can pray throughout the day.
  - + God our Father is so good to us. No matter where we go or what we do. God is there, watching lovingly over us. God our loving Father is watching over us early in the morning when we wake up. What can you do early in the morning to let your heavenly Father know that you love him? (think of God; pray) When you think about God and when you love God, you are praying. It is good to think quietly about God every morning.
  - + What might you tell God in the morning? (Thank you for caring for me all night. Help me be a good person. I love you and will try to please you today.) (Write the children's suggestions on the board under the word Morning.]
- + How can you let your loving Father know during the day that you care about him? When might you want to talk to him? (when I need help; when something nice happens and I want to thank him; when something sad happens and I ask for help; when I want to tell about some fun I had: when I want to tell God how great he is; when I want to tell him I love him; when I want to thank him for my food) [List the children's suggestions on the board under Daytime.]
- + What will you tell God at bedtime? (Thank you for caring for me all day. I'm sorry if I hurt someone or was stubborn or mean. Bless those I love. Take care of me all night.) [List these under Bedtime.]

### Acting

## 1. Have the class create Morning, Daytime, or

Bedtime prayers. · Divide the class into groups,

- depending on the size of the class. Assign each group either Morning, Daytime, or Bedtime prayers.
- ◆ Direct each group to write a prayer for that particular time of day, using the suggestions from the board.
- ♦ When all have finished, invite them to share their prayers with the class.
- 2. Encourage the children to pray to God every day.

## **Before You Begin**

 God is transcendent, far beyond us, yet imminent, very close to us. The only proper response to our great and loving God is heartfelt reverence. Children are quick to understand the awe we naturally have for God and the love that is evoked by God's presence. Habits and attitudes formed during this impressionable age can endure into adulthood.

2. In this lesson, the children learn to revere God's name and worship as God wishes through the celebration of Sunday Mass.

## Centering

- Recall the last class by displaying the three hearts.
  - Which way of showing love for God did we talk about yesterday? (praying)
- ♦ When can you pray? (anytime)
  - ◆ Where is God? (everywhere)

#### 2. Discuss God's goodness.

- Because God is so great, so wonderful, so wise, so powerful, and so loving, we honor God in a special way. We show reverence for God by honoring God's name and the Lord's Day. [Point to the other two hearts.]
- Explain that these three hearts refer to the first three commandments.
- Direct the children to the listing of the Ten Commandments at the back of their books on page 181 and point out the first three.

## Sharing

1. Tell the story of Moses and God.

## Moses and the Burning Bush

Moses was a man who came to be a good friend of God's. One day while Moses was watching his sheep, God spoke to him from a burning bush. Even though the bush was on fire, it did not burn up. Moses took off his sandals because he was in God's holy presence. When Moses asked God what his name was, God answered, "Yahweh," Because Moses and his people had so much reverence for God, they never dared to say this name aloud. They called God Lobo instead.

- We should have so much reverence for God that we always use his name with great care and love.
- Hand out drawing paper to the children and ask them to draw a picture of the burning bush and then set it aside.

- Help the children show their love by using God's name reverently.
  - Names are important to God and to us. How do you feel when someone makes fun of your name or says your name in an angry voice? (sad, angry). Why do you feel this way?
  - It is wrong to use a person's name this way. It is even worse to use God's name without love. Why? (because God loves me more than anyone else does)
  - When we pray, we use God's name with love. We use God's name with love when we tell other people about things Jesus did. We use God's name with love when we sing songs that bonor him.

- 3. Have the children return to their burning bush drawings. Have them title their drawing "God" and write Father, Son, and Holy Spirit elsewhere on their paper.
- 4. Discuss Sunday Mass.
  - + There is one day every week that we call the Lord's Day. What day do we celebrate as the Lord's Day? (Sunday)
  - \* We keep the Lord's Day holy by remembering Jesus' greatest act of love. What was it? (his dying on the cross and rising to new life) We celebrate this at every Mass. We take part in Mass every Saturday evening or Sunday because Jesus said to remember his love in this way. The Mass is the greatest prayer.
- + What do we do at Mass? (We gather as God's people to listen to God's Word. We thank God for everything.) We give ourselves with Jesus to the Father. Then the Father gives Jesus to us in Holy Communion and makes us one in love.
  - + God commands us to keep his day holy. God wants us to worship him at Mass every weekend. What are we telling God our Father by taking part in Mass every weekend? (that we love him)
- 5. Discuss Sunday as a day of rest.
  - + Sunday should be a day to celebrate, a day to rest from the hard work we do during the week. How does it feel not to have to go to school on Sunday?
  - + What could you do to make every Sunday a holy and happy day, a day of rest?
- 6. Help the children complete the word banners on page 33.

## **Before You Begin**

- In this lesson, the children will learn that all of us are called to celebrate and praise God. The act of celebration outwardly expresses our inner feelings of joy.
- Just as we all differ in looks and personality, so do we differ in the manner in which we best express our feelings. Today the children will express their love for God through the works of their hands in creating a windsock.
- 3. When planning today's lesson, keep in mind that Day Four is when the children take the quiz for this chapter. Reserve time at the end of class for this assessment. The quiz can also be administered on Day Five.

## Centering .

Ask a volunteer to read aloud the adaptation of John 15:10–11 from page 29 in their book.

- → Tell the children that after the reading, the reader says "The Gospel of the Lord."
- Ask the children what the response to that statement is. ("Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.")

  - Color and decorate the Celebrate God section.
  - Cut apart and decorate the bottom strips.
  - Glue or staple the strips to the blank area next to the Celebrate God section.
  - Glue or staple the Celebrate God section to form a cylinder.
  - Punch two holes opposite each other on the top of the cylinder, run the string or yarn through, and tie.

 Hang the children's windsocks around the room to celebrate God's presence with them. You might want to use an electric fan to 100 gu simulate wind in the classroom.

- 2. Lead the children through the Review activities, page 34.
- 3. BLM 10 Distribute and administer BLM 10 Chapter 5 Ouiz.

Use this opportunity to assess the children's understanding of the main concepts in the chapter. If there is not sufficient time for the children to complete the quiz, consider moving it to Day Five.

## Acting

1. Have the children remove the Top Ten CDs and the cover.



- · Help them tape or staple the cover for the CDs and write their names on the covers and color them.
- + These CDs will help you remember the key terms for the Ten Commandments. Line up on your desk the three key terms you have already learned, (pray, name, Lord's Dav)
- ◆ Tell the children to keep their CD pack with their religion books to use later or collect them and store them to use in future lessons.
- 2. Have the children pray together We Respond on page 34.
- 3. Invite the children to take home and show their families their Celebrate God Windsock
- 4. At the end of class, have them tear out page 34. Encourage them to share Building Family Faith with their families.

# **Day Five** Extending the Chapter

Use the following suggestions to create an additional lesson for Day Five.

- 1. Remind the children to take home page 34 to share what they are learning with their families.
- 2. Incorporate any unused BLMs from the week's chapter.

#### **Enriching the Faith Experience Chapter Five**

Use the following activities to enrich a lesson or to replace an activity with one that better meets the needs of your class.

- 1. As the children study the commandments, have them make a booklet with a page about each key term studied. Each page could include the key term and pictures related to it. You might have the class make one large booklet with simple sentences to explain each commandment.
- 2. Teach the children a way to remember to pray.
  - + Once there was a boy who did a trick to remind himself to say his morning and evening prayers. At night, he knelt down and put his shoes way under the bed. In the morning, he knelt down and crawled under the bed for his shoes. Whenever he knelt down, he remembered to pray.
  - + Try this trick or make up one of your own to help you remember to say your prayers.
- 3. Take the children to church and review some of the objects found there. Review why people in church genuflect, bless themselves with holy water, and kneel. Let the children practice doing these things. Refer to the kindergarten and first-grade Teacher Guides for ideas.

- 4. Suggest that when the children get up in the morning, they pray the Sign of the Cross. Remind them that when they touch their foreheads, chests, and shoulders, they are telling God that they are offering their minds, hearts, and bodies to him.
- 5. Challenge another class in creating a "100 Times to Pray Every Day" list. Tape a long sheet of butcher paper to the floor and list as many ideas for times to pray as possible. (Examples: when feeding your pet, when shooting a basketball, before sharpening a pencil) Encourage the children to be creative. Hang the finished chart in the hallway. Celebrate with the other class that all are winners when we pray.
