### Catechist Background

How are you responding to Jesus' call?

The invitation Jesus gave to Peter and Andrew is amazing. "As he was walking by the Sea of Galillee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him' (Matthew 4:18). Jesus spoke directly and they followed immediately! What we know and believe is that each of us, as a baptized Christian, is called in much the same way. Christ expects us to follow also, in whatever ways we can find to use the talents God has given us.

Later in the Gospel, we read that Jesus calmed the storm when his friends were afraid. (See Luke 8:22–25.) He took away their fear by giving them confidence in his power and by assuring them of his presence. Christ is here for us in the same way when we, too, ask for help. Go to www.webelieveweb.com, Catechist/ Teacher, We Believe Correlations for this chapter's correlation to the Six Tasks of Catechesis.

In these incidents we see that Jesus called, he calmed, and very importantly, he also taught his disciples to pray. (See Matthew 6:5-8.) Jesus taught prayer first by his own example and then by his words. By your own prayer, you are leading in the manner that Jesus led his followers. Like him, you show both by example and by word.

These three incidents are models for each baptized person. As a catechist, you are following Christ by using your talents with your class, by asking for God's help when you need it, and by praying often.







The concept of Jesus inviting people to be his followers is more fully developed in the Grade 2 We Believe text. For now, explain to the children that Jesus invited many people to be his followers. Some accepted Jesus' invitation, and some did not. Some followers traveled with Jesus most of the time; some went to see him when he was near their homes.

**Pray** Invite the children to pray the Sign of the Cross and the *We Gather* prayer.

Focus on Life Ask the children to think about the way they feel when they receive a special invitation from a friend. Encourage volunteers to act out these situations. Share the Chapter Story on guide page 95C. Tell the children that in this lesson they will learn that Jesus asked people to be his followers.



**Act Out the Story** If time permits, invite volunteers to act out the Scripture story. Have the children look at the picture on the pages. Ask some children to take the parts of the people sitting on the beach.





Do the Activity Point out to the children that along with saying the words, we can also use prayerful actions as we pray the Lord's Prayer. Encourage the children to give their ideas on some actions that can be done as they pray. Offer a few suggestions. For example, you might point upward for "Our Father, who art in heaven." Then place the palms of your hands together for "hallowed be thy name." When the children have decided on actions for the whole prayer, have them stand. Ask a few volunteers to lead the class. Together read the prayer aloud along with the prayerful actions.

- ✓ When we pray the Lord's Prayer, what do we ask God? (We ask God to give us what we need; to forgive us; to keep us from anything that goes against his love.)

Connect to Life Invite volunteers to answer the We Respond question. Explain: We pray the Lord's Prayer with our parish family at Mass. We can pray the Lord's Prayer with others or by ourselves. For example, you may pray it upon waking up or before going to bed, before going to school, or when you are sad or afraid. Stress: Praying this prayer at any time will bring you closer to God.

Distribute copies of Reproducible Master 8. Have the children color the border of the chart. Encourage the children to show the chart to their families.
