# The Gospel According to Mark

The Gospel According to Mark was the first Gospel to be written. It is shorter than Matthew, Luke, and John. But like those Gospels, it has many stories about what Jesus said and did. Mark's Gospel helps us to be better followers of Jesus. It teaches us to love like Jesus. It teaches us to follow his Commandments. It reminds us that Jesus suffered and that we might have to suffer too. But it also reminds us to have hope. If we love Jesus and follow his Commandments, one day we will live with him in Heaven.

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# The Preaching of John the Baptist

1 This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. 2 It began as the prophet Isaigh had written:

"God said, 'I will send my messenger ahead of you to open the way for you.' 3 Someone is shouting in the desert.

'Get the road ready for the Lord;

make a straight path for him to travell'"

4 So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. "Turn away from your sins and be baptized," he told the people, "and God will forgive your sins." 5 Many people from the province of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to hear John. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the Jordan River.

6 John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 7 He announced to the people, "The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and unite his sandals. 8 I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with Holy Spirit."

9 Not long afterward Jesus came from Nazareth in the province of Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan. 10 As soon as Jesus came up out of the water, he saw heaven opening and the Spirit coming down on him like a dove. 11 And a voice came from heaven, "You are my own dear Son. I am pleased with you." 12 At once the Spirit made him generated the desert, 13 where he stayed forty days, being tempted by Satam Wild animals were there also, but angels came and helped him.

41 Jesus was filled with pity, and reached out and touched him. "I do want to," he answered. "Be clean!"
42 At once the disease left the man, and he was clean. 43 Then Jesus spoke sternly to him and sent him away at once, 44 after saying to him, "Listen, don't tell anyone about this. But go straight to the priest and let him examine you; then in order to prove to everyone that you are cured, offer the sacrifice that Moses ordered."

45 But the man went away and began to spread the news every-where. Indeed, he talked so much that Jesus could not go into a town publicly. Instead, he stayed out in lonely places, and people came to him from everywhere.

### Jesus Heals a Paralyzed Man

1 A few days later Jesus went back to Capernaum, and the news spread that he was at home. 2 So many people came together that there was no room left, not even out in front of the door. Jesus was preaching the message to them 3 when four men arrived, carrying a paralyzed man to Jesus. 4 Because of the crowd, however, they could not get the man to him. So they

15 Later on Jesus was having a meal in Levi's house. A large number of tax collectors and other outcasts was following Jesus, and many of them joined him and his disciples at the table. 16 Some teachers of the Law, who were Pharisees, saw that Jesus

was eating with these outcasts and collectors, so they asked his discip "Why does he eat with such people"

17 Jesus heard them and swered, "People who are well do need a doctor, but only those who sick. I have not come to call respended by the people, but outcasts."

### The Man with a Paralyzed Hand

1 Then Jesus went back to the synagogue, where there was a man who ad a paralyzed hand. 2 Some people ere there who wanted to accuse Jesus doing wrong; so they watched him dosely to see whether he would cure man on the Sabbath. 3 Jesus said to be man, "Come up here to the front."

Then he asked the people, "What does our Law allow us to do on the Sabbath? To help or to harm? To save pomeone's life or to destroy it?"

But they did not say a thing, 5 Jesus was angry as he looked around at them, but at the same time he felt sorry for them, because they were so stubborn and wrong. Then he said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and it become well again. 6 So the Pharisees left the synagogue and met at once with some members of Herod's party, and they made plans to kill Jesus.

### A Crowd by the Lake

7 Jesus and his disciples went away to Lake Galilee, and a large crowd

followed him. They had come from Galilee, from Judea, 8 from Jerusalem, from the territory of Idumea, from the territory on the east side of the Jordan, and from the region around the cities of Tyre and Sidon. All these people came to Jesus because they had heard of the things he was doing. 9 The crowd was so large that Jesus told his disciples to get a boat ready for him, so that the people would not crush him. 10 He had healed many people, and all the sick kept pushing their way to him in order to touch him. 11 And whenever the people who had evil spirits in them saw him, they would fall down before him and scream, "You are the Son of God!"

12 Jesus sternly ordered the evil spirits not to tell anyone who he was.

# Jesus Chooses the Twelve Apostles

13 Then Jesus went up a hill and called to himself the men he wanted. They came to him, 14 and he chose twelve, whom he named apostles. "I have chosen you to be with me," he told them. "I will also send you out to preach, 15 and you will have authority to drive out demons."

16 These are the twelve he chose: Simon (Jesus gave him the name Peter); 17 James and his brother John, the sons of Zebedee (Jesus gave them the name Boanerges, which means "Men of Thunder"); 18 Andrew, Phillip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Patriot, 19 and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed Jesus.

### Jesus and Beelzebul

20 Then Jesus went home. Again such a large crowd gathered that Jesus

22 Some teachers of the Law who had come from Jerusalem were saying, "He has Beelzebul in him! It is the chief of the demons who gives him the power to drive them out."

23 So Jesus called them to him and spoke to them in parables: "How can Satan drive out Satan? 24 If a country divides itself into groups which fight each other, that country will fall apart. 25 If a family divides itself into groups which fight each other, that family will fall apart. 26 So if Satan's kingdom divides into groups, it cannot last, but will fall apart and come to an end.

27 "No one can break into a strong man's house and take away his belongings unless he first ties up the strong man; then he can plunder his house.

28 "I assure you that people can be forgiven all their sins and all the evil things they may say. 29 But whoever says evil things against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven, because he has committed an eternal sin." [30 Jesus said this because some people were saying, "He has an evil spirit in him."]

#### Jesus' Mother and Brothers

31 Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. They stood outside the house and sent in a message, asking for him.
32 A crowd was sitting around Jesus, and they said to him, "Look, your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, and they want you."

33 Jesus answered, "Who is my mother? Who are my brothers?" 34 He

looked at the people sitting around him and said, "Look! Here are mother and my brothers! 35 Whodoes what God wants is my brother my sister, my mother."

### A Lamp under a Bowl

Jesus continued, "Does anyone ver bring in a lamp and put it under bowl or under the bed? Isn't it put the lampstand? 22 Whatever is hidden away will be brought out into the open, and whatever is covered up will be uncovered. 23 Listen, then, if you have ears!"

24 He also said to them, "Pay attention to what you hear! The same rules you use to judge others will be used by God to judge you—but with even greater severity. <sup>25</sup> Those who have something will be given more, and those who have nothing will have taken away from them even the little they have."

### The Parable of the Growing Seed

26 Jesus went on to say, "The Kingdom of God is like this. A man scatters seed in his field. 27 He sleeps at night, is up and about during the day, and all the while the seeds are sprouting and growing. Yet he does not know how if happens. 28 The soil itself makes the plants grow and bear fruit; first the tender stalk appears, then the head, and finally the head full of grain. 29 When the grain is ripe, the man starts cutting it with his sickle, because harvest time has come.

### The Parable of the Mustard Seed

30 "What shall we say the Kingdom of God is like?" asked Jesus. "What parable shall we use to explain it? 31 It is like this. A man takes a mustard seed, the smallest seed in the world, and plants it in the ground. 32 After a while it grows up and becomes the biggest of all plants. It puts out such large branches that the birds come and make their nests in its shade."

33 Jesus preached his message to the people, using many other parables like these: he told them as much as
