

DEARFAMILY

In Unit 2 your child will grow as a disciple of Jesus by:

- showing love for God and others by following the Ten Commandments and the Great Commandment

What's the Word?

Celebrate!

Prepare for the coming Sunday to be the Lord's Day in a special way. Look over the Sunday Scripture readings together, and talk about the ways you will participate in Mass. (See "This Week's Liturgy" on www.webelieveweb.com.) What Corporal or Spiritual Work of Mercy (page 138) might you do on Sunday to show that your family cares for people in need?

Learning About God's Law

WE GATHER

Father, help me to hear your call.

Think of a time when you were chosen to do something. What was it?

WE BELIEVE

In the Old Testament we learn about the relationship between God and his people. We read the history of God's people in the time before the birth of Jesus.

God called Abraham to be the father of his people. Abraham and his wife, Sarah, had no children. So God promised that they would have a child and many grandchildren. Abraham and Sarah did have a child. Isaac, and many grandchildren.

Jacob was one of Abraham and Sarah's many descendants. God chose Jacob as he had chosen Abraham. God changed Jacob's name to Israel. From then on, these people whom God chose as his own were called the Israelites.

God showed his great love for the Israelites, and they showed their love for God. They called on God for help and guidance. They gave praise to God's name. God remembered his people and heard them. He cared for and protected them.

God's people were living in the area of the Middle East that is now the country called Israel. However, in the time of the

> Old Testament, this land was called Canaan. Once a great famine forced God's people



to leave their homes in Canaan. They went to Egypt to find food. They staved in Egypt, but they later lost their freedom there. God's people became slaves. They were forced to work for the pharaoh, the ruler of Egypt.

God wanted his people to be free to love and worship him. So God chose Moses to lead the people out of Egypt to freedom.

Exodus 3:6-10

God said to Moses, "'I am the God of your father,' he continued, 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob.""

God told Moses that he had seen the way his people were suffering in Egypt. God said, "Therefore I have come down to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey."

Illustrate some of the ways God acted in the lives of his people.



Then God said to Moses, "Come, now! I will send you to Pharaoh to lead my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt" (Exodus 3:6, 8, 10).

With Moses to lead them and God guiding their way, the people left Egypt. They were heading for Canaan, the land God had promised them.

WE RESPOND

Moses answered God's call to lead the people to freedom. God guided Moses and his people. How does God guide us today?

The Ten Commandments are God's Laws for his people.

WE GATHER

God, your Laws show us how to live a life of love.

Did you ever make an agreement with a teacher, a coach, or a parent? If you did, what did you agree to do? What did the other person agree to do? Why are agreements important?

WE BELIEVE

As Moses and God's people escaped Egypt, "The LORD preceded them, in the daytime by means of a column of cloud to show them the way, and at night by means of a column of fire to give them light. Thus they could travel both day and night. Neither the column of cloud by day nor the column of fire by night ever left its place in front of the people" (Exodus 13:21-22).

In the desert between Egypt and Canaan, the Israelites came to a mountain called Mount Sinai. God asked Moses to climb the mountain. There on the mountain God made a special agreement with Moses and the people. God promised to be their God if they would be his people. This special agreement between God and his people is called a covenant.

The covenant describes the relationship between God and his people. In this covenant God promised to protect his people and to help them live in freedom. In return the Israelites promised to live as God wanted them to live. They promised to worship him, the one true God.

On Mount Sinai God gave Moses and his people the Law that he wanted them to follow. He gave them the Ten Commandments. God's people promised to keep the Ten Commandments as their part of the covenant.

The **Ten Commandments** are the Laws of God's covenant given to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Israelites, who later became known as the Jewish People, followed these Laws. The Ten Commandments are God's Laws for us. too.

We find the Ten Commandments in the Old Testament. They are listed in the Books of Exodus and Deuteronomy.

- 10. You shall not covet your NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.

God gave us the Ten Commandments so we can know how to live a life of love. The first three commandments help us to show love and respect for God. The other seven commandments help us to show love and respect for ourselves and others.

WE RESPOND

Psalm 100: We Are His People

WE BELIEVE

Throughout history people have loved God and have wanted to live by his Law. Yet when we read the Bible, we see that God's people did not always live up to their part of the covenant. Even though they loved God and tried to be faithful to him, they did not always follow the Ten Commandments.

God loved his people so much that he never turned away from them. When he saw his people failing, God sent prophets to remind them to keep the covenant. The prophets told the people about God's love for them. By their words and actions, the prophets encouraged the people to trust in God and have faith in him. The prophets reminded the people that God had promised to save them from sin.

God kept his promise. He sent his own Son into the world to save all people from sin. Jesus is the Son of God.



When Jesus was growing up in Nazareth, he studied the teachings of the Old Testament. He learned about the covenant God made with his people. He studied the Ten Commandments. He lived his life according to the covenant. People saw that Jesus lived his life in love for God his Father and in service to others.


One day someone asked Jesus, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" We call Jesus' answer the Great Commandment. Jesus said to the man, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:36, 37). This is the first part of the Great Commandment. It sums up the first three of the Ten Commandments.

Jesus also told the man, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:39). This part of the Great Commandment sums up the Fourth through Tenth Commandments.

Jesus himself lived out the Great Commandment. He showed us that keeping the Ten Commandments means loving God above all else and loving others as ourselves.

WE RESPOND

With a partner, talk about ways that Jesus may have showed his love for God and others. Then in the space below, make a Word Find using those things. Exchange your puzzle with another group and have them find and circle the words.

As Catholics...

God sent many prophets to his people. One of the greatest of these was Isaiah. Isaiah told the people that God would never abandon them, that God would send them a Savior. Jesus is the Savior Isaiah told the people about.

Every year during Advent and Christmas, we hear the words of Isaiah: "For a child is born to us, a son is given us" (Isaiah 9:5). Jesus is the Son of God and our Savior.

Jesus teaches us to love one another.

WE GATHER

Jesus, teach me to love others as you did.

Discuss someone who is a good example to you. What does this person do? How does the person act? What makes you want to do or say the same kinds of things?

WE BELIEVE

On the night before he died, Jesus told his disciples, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34–35).

Jesus was a perfect example of love for God and neighbor. He lived by the Ten Commandments. When we love as Jesus did, we also show love for God and others. Loving one another as Jesus did helps us to follow the Ten Commandments.

Jesus showed his love in many ways. He listened to those who were lonely. He went out of his way to help people in need. He spoke out for the freedom of all people and for those who were treated unjustly. Jesus protected people who could not protect themselves. He treated all people equally and respected the dignity of each person.

All people are created by God to share in his life and love. We are called to respect the human dignity of all people. Each and every person has the same basic rights. We call the basic rights that all people have human rights.



These rights include the

- right to life. This the most basic of all human rights.
- · right to faith and family
- · right to education and work
- right to equal treatment and safety
- · right to housing and health care.






