#### 7. JESUS CHANGES WATER INTO WINE


One day Mary was invited to a wedding feast. Jesus and His special friends went with her.

the good news of God's great love for us. Many people went to hear Him.


Some became His special friends and helpers. From these Jesus chose twelve men who would share His life in a special way. They were called Apostles.


#### 9. JESUS TEACHES THE PEOPLE

#### 12. JESUS FEEDS THE PEOPLE


It was a long day. The large crowd listened to Jesus for many hours. Now they were hungry.

### **13. JESUS SHOWS HIS GLORY**


