Dear Parents and Teachers:

Saints and Me! is a six-set series of children's books about saints, including the: Saints of North America who served our homeland; Saints of Christmas, who teach us to love Jesus; Saints for Families, who modeled God's love within and for the domestic Church; Saints for Communities, who served Jesus through various roles and professions; and Saints for Sacraments, who showed great love for the sacraments.

The eight books in *Saints of the Beatitudes* (a word meaning "a list of blessings from God") introduce nine holy people who exemplify attributes Jesus articulated in his Sermon on the Mount. Faustina Kowalska's diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, read by millions, helped spread God's message of mercy. Patrick, a missionary, brought Christianity to Ireland. Monica prayed her wayward son, Augustine, would return to the faith. He did and was canonized. Katharine Drexel abandoned her comfortable life to become a nun. Carlo Acutis shared his faith and love of the Eucharist through technology. Bernadette Soubirous experienced visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope John XXIII convoked the Second Vatican Council, hoping to revive the Church. Jude was an apostle of our Lord.

Which saint was captured by pirates and sold into slavery? Name the saints with back-to-back feast days (August 27–28). Who gave \$20 million to build churches and schools? Who created a website about eucharistic miracles? Who did Jesus appear and speak to? Who said, "My job is to inform, not to convince"? Who wrote *Peace on Earth* in 1963? Who is the patron of impossible causes? Find out in the *Saints of the Beatitudes* set—part of the *Saints and Me!* series—and help children connect to the lives of the saints.

GLOSSARY (NEW WORDS)

Bishop: A priest who leads many churches in a certain area

Blessed Trinity: Three persons in one God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy SpiritChristianity: A religion that teaches about Jesus

Culture: The way a group of people lives: their beliefs, language, and social habits

- **Deacon:** An ordained man who serves the Church by helping priests and bishops with duties
- Harbor: A safe area of water where boats can anchor
- **Missionary:** A person who teaches the faith or preaches the gospel in a certain area
- **Monastery:** The place where a religious order lives, prays, and works
- **Ordained:** To receive the sacrament of holy orders and become a deacon, priest, or bishop
- **Pirate:** A person who attacks ships at sea or towns near the shore

Preach: To teach about the faith


Priest: An ordained minister who celebrates the sacraments, preaches the gospel, and takes care of God's people

Shepherd: A person who takes care of sheep


- Slave: A person who is owned by another person and works without pay






