#### **Dear Parents and Teachers:**

Saints and Me! is a six-set series of children's books about saints, including the: Saints of North America who served our homeland; Saints of Christmas, who teach us to love Jesus; Saints for Families, who modeled God's love within and for the domestic Church; Saints for Communities, who served Jesus through various roles and professions; and Saints for Sacraments, who showed great love for the sacraments.

The eight books in *Saints of the Beatitudes* (a word meaning "a list of blessings from God") introduce nine holy people who exemplify attributes Jesus articulated in his Sermon on the Mount. Faustina Kowalska's diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, read by millions, helped spread God's message of mercy. Patrick, a missionary, brought Christianity to Ireland. Monica prayed her wayward son, Augustine, would return to the faith. He did and was canonized. Katharine Drexel abandoned her comfortable life to become a nun. Carlo Acutis shared his faith and love of the Eucharist through technology. Bernadette Soubirous experienced visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope John XXIII convoked the Second Vatican Council, hoping to revive the Church. Jude was an apostle of our Lord.



- —**CELEBRATE** the saints and relate them to their lives.






Katharine was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1858. Her father was a successful banker and one of the richest men in America. The Drexels taught their children to be kind and generous to others. They gave a lot of money to charities (places that help people in need). "We are a very lucky family. We should share what we have with others," said her father.





Katharine and her sisters, Elizabeth and Louise, grew up in a loving and faith-filled home. Daily prayer and going to Mass helped their family grow closer to God. Several times a week, Katharine's mother gave food, clothing, and money to the poor in the city. The girls were always ready to help!

**Convent:** A house where a group of women religious live

**Generous:** Sharing or giving more than what is expected, being unselfish

**Heartbroken:** A feeling of great sadness

**Meek:** Gentle, humble; being patient when you are unfairly treated

**Mission:** A community of people who live and work together; missions are served by religious leaders who start schools and churches and preach the gospel

**Missionary:** A person who teaches the faith or preaches the gospel in a certain place

**Mother:** The superior or leader of a group of women religious

**Native Americans:** Tribal groups of people native to the United States

**Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament:** A group of women religious started by Saint Katharine Drexel in 1891

**Sisters of Mercy:** A group of women religious started by Catherine McAuley in 1831


**Spiritual Director:** One who guides people in their faith

one of saint Katharine prexet's greatest achievements was the founding of xavier university in new orleans, the first catholic university for Black Students.






