For Catechists and Teachers

Scripture Background

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus enters the life and home of Zacchaeus, a cheater and a sinner in the eyes of his neighbors. He was not only a tax collector and, therefore, an agent of the Romans, but he also regularly cheated his fellow Jews. Jesus doesn't focus on Zacchaeus's sinful past. He is concerned with Zacchaeus's change of heart.

Connecting Scripture and Doctrine

The Gospels tell many stories about Jesus sharing meals. He ate with people like Zacchaeus, who was a tax collector. Tax collectors were Jewish men who worked for the Romans. They often cheated the Jewish people by taking extra tax money. Many Jewish people thought Jesus shouldn't eat with sinners, but he came to save all people. He shares his Body and Blood with us in the Eucharist.

"Jesus invites *sinners* to the table of the kingdom: 'I came not to call the righteous, but sinners.' He invites them to that conversion without which one cannot enter the kingdom, but shows them in word and deed his Father's boundless mercy for them" (*CCC*, 545, citing Luke 15:7).

Sharing the Lesson with Families

Encourage parents to talk with their child about friendship and the difference Jesus' friendship made in Zacchaeus's life. Emphasize that developing a friendship with Jesus can change their child's life too. Suggest that parents plan an activity their child and a friend can do together. Encourage parents to take their child to Mass on All Saints' Day (Holy Day of Obligation).

Teaching This Week's Lesson

Share Experiences

Objective The children will identify what friends do together.



Gather in a prayer circle. Play and sing "Come and Follow Me" (CD-2, #14).

Gathering Prayer Invite a child to point to the current Sunday on a Church Year calendar. **Pray:** "Jesus, we want to follow you. Help us learn your teachings and follow your way. Help us to share your Good News with others." The children respond, "Amen."

Story • Friends spend time together. (page 1)

A coloring page to accompany this story is available at gospelweeklies. com/lesson-updates. Gather in a seated story circle. Ask: What do you like to do with your friends? Invite them to think of a time when they were left out of an activity. Ask: How did you feel? Tell them that today's story begins with a boy named Duan feeling lonely and left out. Distribute *Promise*. Invite the children to follow the story on the cover as you read it aloud.

Discuss the story. **Ask:** Which boy felt lonely and left out? Which boy invited him to be on his team? How do you know the two boys are friends at the end of the story? Direct the children to move to the work area and use the pictures to tell the story to a partner.

Activity • I play with my friends. (page 2) Remain in the work area and turn to page 2. Read aloud the title. Invite the children to take turns describing what is happening in each photo. Read aloud the question under one of the photos and invite volunteers to answer the question. Make sure each child has a chance to contribute an answer to one of the questions.

Distribute crayons and invite the children to draw pictures of themselves and a friend in the open frame.

Activity • **Move and Pretend** Move to an open area and assign partners. **Ask:** What do friends do together? Explain that each pair of children will act out something friends do together. The rest of the class will guess what they are acting out. Direct the pairs to quietly decide what to act out. Give each pair of children a chance to act.

Discover Gospel and Doctrine

Objectives • The children will:

- Identify that Jesus wants to make friends with all people.
- Recognize that being friends with Jesus changes us.



Play and sing "Gospel Acclamation" (CD-2, #24) as preparation for the proclamation of the Gospel.

Sunday Gospel • Jesus Makes Friends with Zacchaeus Gather in the story circle. Ask: What are some ways Jesus helped people? Tell this story about Jesus making friends with a man named Zacchaeus:

One day, Jesus came to the town of Jericho. A rich tax collector named Zacchaeus wanted to see him. But Zacchaeus was a short man, and he couldn't see Jesus because of the crowd. He climbed up a sycamore tree so he could see Jesus.

When Jesus got to the sycamore tree, he looked up at Zacchaeus and said: "Zacchaeus, come down quickly. I want to stay at your home today." Zacchaeus hurried down and welcomed Jesus into his home.

The people grumbled, saying, "Zacchaeus is a sinner, and Jesus is going to his home to eat with him."

Later that day, Zacchaeus said to Jesus: "I will give half of my belongings to the poor. I will pay back four times as much to anyone I have ever cheated."

Because Zacchaeus was sorry for his sins and was making things right, Jesus said: "You and your family have been saved. I came to find and save those who were lost."

Ask: Why didn't people like Zacchaeus? Why did he climb the tree? Why did Jesus stop? Why was Zacchaeus surprised? What do you think Jesus did at Zacchaeus's home? *Visit and share a meal together.* Emphasize Jesus' love and concern for Zacchaeus and how Zacchaeus changed his life and became happier because of Jesus' friendship.

Activity • Who is a friend to Zacchaeus?

(page 3) Move to the work area and invite the children to look at the pictures of the Gospel on page 3. Look together at each picture, asking: What is happening? Who is this? What is this person saying? Point out which man is Zacchaeus. Note that he is collecting taxes—money—for the Romans. Invite the children to find the treasure chest with gold in it. Explain that Zacchaeus put the tax money he collected for Rome in that box. Ask: Where else does he have money? In a bag behind his back. That was the extra money he was taking from the people and keeping for himself.

Invite the children to retell the Gospel story using the four pictures. Read aloud the voice balloons at the bottom of the page. Decide together which voice balloon goes with each picture. Distribute pencils and direct the children to write the number of the picture by the voice balloon that goes with each picture. (They are color coded.)



Tell the story again, this time, reading the copy in the voice balloons.

Activity • **Stretch and Sing** Invite the children to get up and sway, stretch, and sing along to "You've Got to Love Them" (CD-2, #20). Point out that Jesus loves all people. If we want to follow Jesus, he asks us to love all people too.

What the Church Believes and Teaches

Our Church Family (page 16)

Ask: Who did what Jesus said in the Gospel story? Zacchaeus. Ask: What did he do? Climbed down the tree and welcomed Jesus to his home for a meal. Ask: How did Zacchaeus change his life after he became friends with Jesus? He stopped cheating people. He gave to the poor. He aave back what he had stolen.

Ask: Who are some other people from the Bible who did what Jesus said to do? His followers (apostles, disciples).

Emphasize that when people become friends of Jesus, they want to be better people and live like Jesus wants them to. Ask: Is anyone here a friend of Jesus? What things do you choose to do because you know it's what Jesus wants you to do? Tell the truth, help at home, go to Mass, be kind, share, pray, etc.

Ask: What did Jesus do at Zacchaeus's home? *Ate a meal.* Ask: What is a very special meal that we share with the family of the Church? Mass, the Eucharist, Holy Communion.

Help the children locate page 16 in their handbooks. Read aloud the text, leaving out an occasional word for the children to fill in. Distribute crayons and invite the children to trace and color the letters of MASS.



Have the children close the What the Church Believes and Teaches handbooks and return to Promise, page 4.

Word of the Week • Mass (page 2) Write Mass on the board. Share this definition: We gather at Mass to remember and thank Jesus.

Live the Gospel

Objective The children will pray the Lord's Prayer.

Prayer Activity • Jesus' friends pray. (page 4)

Ask: What is the prayer Jesus taught his followers to pray? *The* Lord's Prayer (also Our Father). Point out that we pray this prayer at every Mass.

This activity gives the children their own copy of the Lord's Prayer (Our Father) to color and display in their homes. As the children work on this activity, circulate among them and ask for questions. Some questions, especially vocabulary clarifications, may be handled in the larger group. Other guestions that arise may be more personal and handled individually.

Closing Prayer Gather in the prayer circle with the children's copies of the Lord's Prayer. Pray the prayer aloud together. Then direct the children to put their copies on the floor in front of them, join hands, and pray the prayer again.



Close your *Promise* session by playing and singing "Come and Follow Me" (CD-2, #17).






