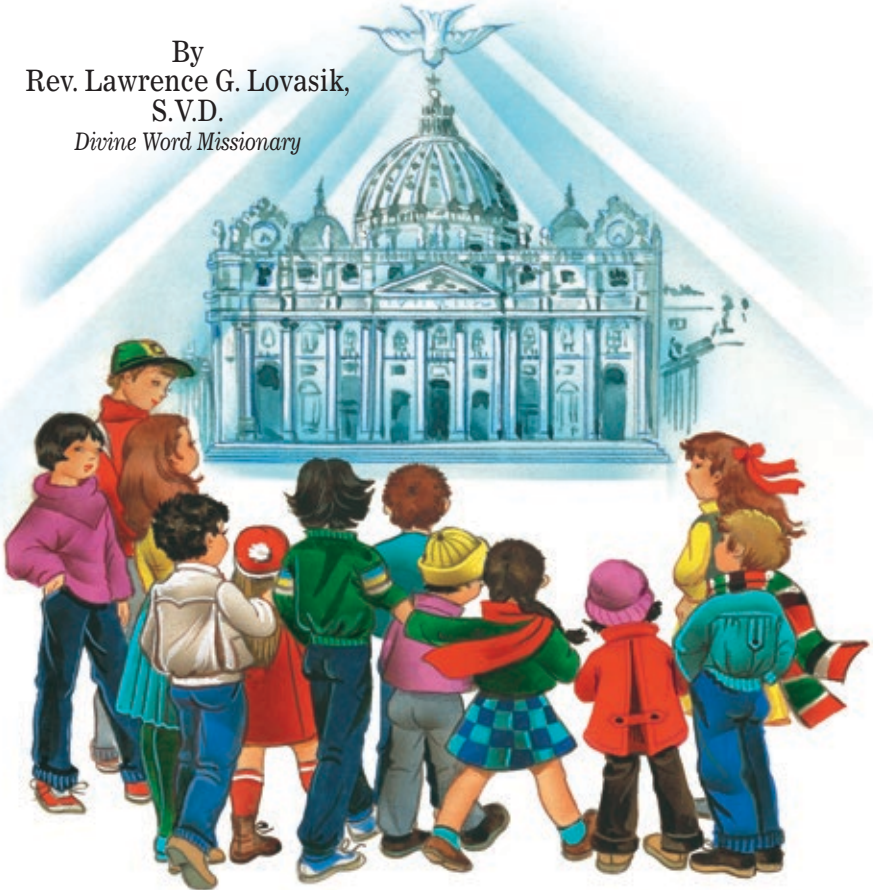

3rd PRECEPT OF THE CHURCH

To study Catholic teaching to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation, to be confirmed, and then to continue to study our holy Faith and help others to know about it

The Sacrament of Confirmation

CONFIRMATION is the Sacrament by which those born again in Baptism now receive the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Father and the Son.

Confirmation strengthens the life of the Spirit received at Baptism. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit once more to Christian souls with new grace and new strength to lead the Christian life.

The Holy Spirit prepares us to be witnesses of Christ by a sincere Christian life, and to spread and defend the Faith while living in the world.

When we are confirmed a duty is placed on us to bring Jesus Christ, His example, His way of life, and His Church to others. The strength of the grace of the Holy Spirit will help us to do so if we show some effort and ask for His help in prayer.
