Noah

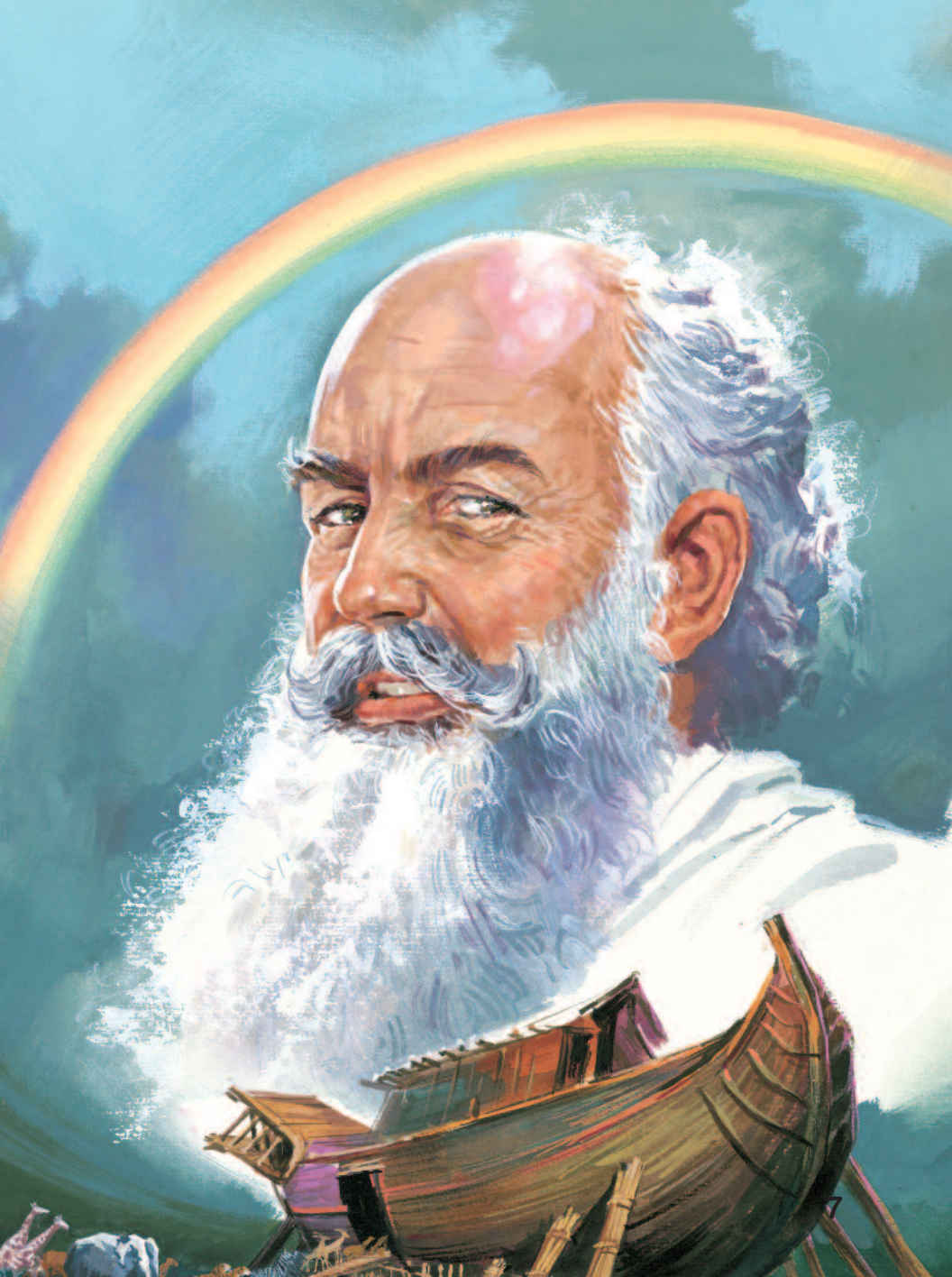
And the Flood
