



You will not be alone as you journey through **Christ In Us**. You will have a lot of **Partners in Faith**—saints and other holy people who lived amazing lives—walking with you.







od loves us. He knows everything about us. God wants us to know him, too. How do we come to know God? In many ways! We learn about God most fully from Jesus. We also learn about God from the Bible, the Church, and creation. They teach us about God's love and about his promise to love us forever.

We learn about God's love.

How can you tell when people love you? Maybe they take care of you or spend time with you. God loves us, too. He promises to love us forever.

We learn about God's love in many ways. Look around! God made the world so we would know his goodness and love. God showed his love for us the most by sending us his divine Son, Jesus.

God sent an angel to visit a young woman named Mary. Angels are spiritual beings God created. They do not have a body as humans do. They give glory to God. They are also messengers of God.

The angel told Mary she was going to have a baby. The baby was God's own Son, Jesus.

What do I know about God?

We learn about God's love for us through everything Jesus said and did. Jesus taught people about God. He helped and healed people. He included people who were left out.

The Bible teaches us about God's promises.

God did not leave us alone to come to know him. God tells us in the Bible about himself and his love. The Bible is the book that contains his own Word.

God gave the writers of the Bible a gift to help them write it. The Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, helped them so we could come to know and love God.

The Bible tells us that God made a **covenant**, or an agreement, between himself and his people. In this covenant, God promised to love us forever. We would be his people, and he would be our God.

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The most important writings in the Bible are about God's divine Son, Jesus. Jesus teaches us how much God loves us. Jesus also teaches us that God wants us to love each other. Jesus fully shows us who God is because he is the Son of God.

Much of what we know about Jesus is from the Bible. The Bible is not just one book. It is seventy-three smaller books in one. It is full of history, songs, poems, letters, and sayings.

The first part of the Bible is called the Old Testament. In this part, we learn about God's love for his people before Jesus was born.

The second part of the Bible is called the New Testament. In this part, we learn about Jesus, his followers, and the beginning of the Church.


Lectio and Visio Divina

Jesus' life shows us God's love.

God's love for us is enormous. It is like a mountain so high that nobody can ever climb to the top. It is like an ocean so deep that nobody can ever swim to the bottom.

God's love is too great for us to imagine! That is why Jesus was born. Jesus is the divine Son of God. Jesus is God himself telling us how much God loves us.

Jesus showed his Father's love in many ways. Jesus helped people. He healed the sick. He comforted people who were sad. All these things show us how much God loves and cares for us.



Jesus also taught us to love other people.


He showed us how God wants us to act. Jesus helped us to know God better by everything he said and did. Jesus, the Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, showed us how to love God more and more.

Four special books in the New Testament are called the Gospels. They are about Jesus' teachings and his life on earth. The word *Gospel* means "good news." Everything Jesus said and did has taught us about God's love. The Gospel is "good news" for us all.



Apostles the twelve men Jesus chose to lead his disciples

The Church teaches and shares Jesus' message of God's love.

Jesus chose the **Apostles** to continue his work after he died. These twelve men were chosen by Jesus to lead his disciples. The Apostles spent time with Jesus and followed him because he was the Son of God.



Jesus is still with us today. But how? You will not see him walking down the street. But you can hear him speak through the proclamation of the Word in every celebration of the Mass.

That is why Jesus sent his Apostles to tell the world about his Father's love. They did just that. They taught people about Jesus. They passed on what Jesus said and did. The Church calls this Sacred Tradition. Sacred Tradition and Scripture tell us the truth about Jesus.

The **Church** is founded on Jesus, his grace, and his teachings, which his Apostles received and handed down to their successors, the bishops. The Church is a community of people who believe that Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus is the Head of the Church. The Church includes those who, through faith and Baptism, follow the teachings of Jesus and are governed by the bishops in union with the pope. The pope and the bishops guide us in our understanding of Sacred Scripture and Tradition. They are known as the Magisterium, or the teaching office of the Church.

Through Sacred Scripture and Tradition, the Church's Magisterium teaches the message of God's love and shares it with others. We are a part of the Church. We can all help share God's love with others!
