




- He lived in the desert and ate locusts and wild honey.

- <sup>†</sup> In John's Gospel, she is the first person to see the risen Christ, and he sent her to tell the Apostles.




- † He was a Jewish Pharisee who persecuted the first Christians.

- He wrote many letters to the churches he started.


