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#### Introduction

As the revised edition of *The Catholic Connections Handbook for Middle Schoolers (CCH)* has been expanded, and new chapters on Sacred Scripture added throughout, so we have revised and expanded the *Activity Booklet* to include hands-on and creative activities to accompany the fifty chapters of the revised *CCH*.

In this *Activity Booklet*, you will find two activities to supplement each chapter in the *CCH*. How can these activities be used to support the chapter concepts, both within and outside of the classroom? Here are some possibilities:

- As in-class supplements to the chapter. Some activities lend themselves to independent and individual thought on the part of students; other activities lend themselves to cooperative learning in pairs or in groups. An activity sheet can be used as an assessment at the beginning of the lesson (What do students know about this topic?), as a change of pace within the lesson, or as a review at the end of the lesson. If used as a beginning assessment, you may direct the students, at the end of the lesson, to go back to the activity sheet to correct their errors, and thus show them that they have learned something!
- As informal in-class quizzes. In this way, the activity functions as a check of the students' understanding.
- As take-home activities to be shared with the family. The activity thus provides a link to the religious education program.

We hope that these activity sheets will spark your own creativity as you use them to accompany *The Catholic Connections Handbook for Middle Schoolers, Second Edition.* Blessings on your ministry!




